GCSE Attainment and Deprivation

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13.9% of Nottinghamshire pupils in receipt of free school meals (FSM) achieved 5 A* to C passes (including English and maths) compared with 45% of children not in receipt of FSM. Nottinghamshire was ranked 130th out of a total of 148 local authorities for GCSE attainment of FSM pupils. (.Department of Children Schools and Families (DCSF) Statistical First Release January 2008).

A league table released by Save the Children August 2008 placed Nottinghamshire bottom for pupils on FSM achieving 5 good GCSE's. Although more recent interim data provided by schools indicates an improvement in GCSE achievement, there is concern about the low levels of attainment for pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds and whether Nottinghamshire schools are doing enough to improve educational outcomes for pupils in receipt of free school meals.

Objectives

The committee will seek to make recommendations to inform policy development and will consider why receipt of free school meals appears to have a detrimental affect on attainment at school, particularly at GCSE level.

Data for 2008 attainment will become available during the review and this will be examined to see if:

- improvements have occurred
- why some schools are achieving greater success than others The committee also will examine:
 - at what age does deprivation begin to have a negative affect on achievement and what schools are doing to recognise and meet the needs of these children
- the mechanisms used by schools to identify young people from disadvantaged backgrounds who are falling behind their peers
- the interventions used by secondary schools to improve educational outcomes for these young people
- the extent to which education outcomes have 'value added' which is not measurable by examination success results.
- to what extent best practice can be identified and shared with other schools
- what the local authority is doing to assist schools to improve attainment
- Nottinghamshire's attainment against other local authorities who have schools with similar levels of deprivation.











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Risks and issues This review will not consider GCSE attainment for all pupils in

Nottinghamshire schools but will focus on schools that have a high proportion of young people attending school who are disadvantaged using the DCSF indictor - those in receipt of free

schools meals.

Background The free school meal rates indicator gives a broad indication of information levels of deprivation for pupils attending a particular school.

levels of deprivation for pupils attending a particular school. Educational attainment is a shared responsibility between schools and Nottinghamshire County Council; schools however

are responsible for individual pupil's attainment and welfare.

Theme This review falls within the Nottinghamshire Local Area

Agreement 2008 -2011 priority for improving educational attainment and skill levels, specifically within National Indicator 78 a reduction in the number of schools where fewer than 30% of pupils achieve 5 or more GCSE and equivalent including English

and maths.
