She did enjoy some of the books and stickers - It was great to get a parcel each month. The books were varied and not what he would usually read - Yes he looked forward to them, like playing the games more than reading the books - Yes Rhys loved the books and hasn't stopped reading, he has read Beast Quest books every other day he has finished. - These were lovely parcels for my children. The variety was good and all were age appropriate. - I think it help a lot with reading and the joy he got when the parcels arrived. - I think my child benefited apart from the obvious reading etc. He loved receiving a parcel in his name and opening it himself. - Yes, encouraged her to read a wider range of books - Encouraged reading and interest in going to the library - A did benefit from the book and game because it made her get them out and show everyone and loved to show them to all the family - Enjoyed getting a parcel and liked story CDs best. Games did not seem to go down very well - My child liked the idea of getting something for themselves but did not entirely understand what it was for, paper and books are to scribble on and rip - The child was pleased to receive a parcel but after looking at what's inside soon lost interest and put the things away without really looking at them again.

It seems to me it's not children in foster care who need the parcels! - While you are with them it is fine, but on their own they lose interest, and having 3 other children in household it caused a lot of upset and jealousy - I think it does benefit children if they like reading and also on the child's ability to read.
