Local schools and the District Council have supported this initiative by providing Officer/Teaching Staff support. Volunteers are also involved in developing this project	£300
Gypsy and Traveller event - to celebrate GRT history month through a variety of events during Gypsy, Roma Traveller History Month in June 2015. The aim is to raise awareness of the local population and also current issues, including a joint partnership event taking place at Southwell Minster hosted by Southwell Diocese.	Countywide	Raised awareness across local communities and bust myths about GRT communities. Borough and District Councils are supporting the roll out of this initiative and work is now in progress to look at the health and well-being issues faced by GRT communities.	£1,000
Photo Booth Project - This project brings together students from Alderman White School and young adults who have Learning Disabilities with members of the Age UK Men in Sheds project to build a Photo Booth. The photo booth was launched at the Broxtowe Community Celebration event in June 2015. The photo booth was used to interview people who attend the event to get their thoughts and to evaluate the event.	Broxtowe and Countywide	Providing a way to celebrate the contribution of young adults with learning disabilities. Those adults who were involved in the design, interviewing and developing IT skills have been able to start planning future events which use the Booth in different contexts – as an enabling, evaluation and consultation tool.	£1,000

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Promoting inclusive and cohesive communities Super Kitchen Social Eating Space model to various community groups across Broxtowe and Worksop as a way of bringing people together in local communities.	Broxtowe and Worksop	The benefits of these social eating events have included increased feelings of inclusion and well-being, development of informal support networks, modelling table manners and the more obvious delivery of a high-quality hot meal to those who may be struggling to nourish themselves through lack of education or ability. Super Kitchens are affiliated to Fare Share and the meals are cooked using surplus food which would otherwise go to waste and ultimately into landfill.	£1,000
Supporting a community of Iranians living in Nottinghamshire who want to promote Iranian culture and heritage; commemorate different traditional and national occasions; support new Iranian's to the area and familiarize non-Iranians with realities about Iran	Countywide	This is stage one of a much wider project for British Iranians in Nottinghamshire which aims to celebrate their dual heritage. Stage two will include an information and market place event which will demonstrate what services are on offer and how to access them. The long term aim is to open a self-help centre.	£1,000
