DRAFT WORK PROGRAMME AND SCHEDULE OF MEETINGS

Purpose of the Report

1. To give Members an opportunity to consider the initial draft work programme for the Panel and to suggest for topics for inclusion (see appendix).

Information and Advice

- 2. The work programme is intended to assist with the Panel's agenda management and forward planning. The draft programme will be further developed with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Panel (once appointed). It will also be updated and reviewed regularly.
- 3. Ahead of the Police and Crime Commissioner taking up office on 22 November 2012, it is not possible to firm up the work programme. For example, the different PCC candidates may take a different approach to issues such as appointing a Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner.
- 4. With regard to the schedule of future meetings, Members have been consulted about their availability for possible meetings in November 2012, December 2012, early January 2013 and late January 2013 / early February 2013.
- 5. In light of limited Member availability for November 2012 it is now proposed that the Panel meets in early December 2012, early January 2013 and late January 2013. It is also proposed that a further date be scheduled for early February 2013 but this date will only be utilised if the Commissioner's Police Precept report is not available in time for the late January meeting or possibly if a further meeting is required to consider a revised precept. Suggested draft dates will be shared at the first Panel meeting.
- 6. It is proposed that future meetings of the Panel be held in various parts of the Force area (at the relevant Council offices) as a means of increasing public awareness and possible attendance in the meetings.

Other Options Considered

7. All Members of the Panel are able to suggest items for possible inclusion in the work programme.

Reasons for Recommendation/s

8. To enable the work programme to be developed further.

Police Precept	The Panel is required to review and submit a report and recommendation as necessary on the Commissioner's proposed precept by 8 th February 2013.

N.B. If the proposed precept is vetoed a further meeting of the Panel will be needed before 22 nd February 2013 in order to respond to the revised precept from the Commissioner.
The Panel will review and scrutinise any decisions and other actions taken by the Commissioner on an ongoing basis.
The Panel is required to review the Commissioner's annual report about the exercise of his functions in the financial year and progress in meeting police and crime objectives.
The Panel will review and scrutinise any decisions and other actions taken by the Commissioner on an ongoing basis.
The Panel will appoint the Chairman and Vice- Chairman from the members on the Panel.
 The Panel will review its membership to see whether any actions are required in order to meet the requirements for:- the membership to represent all parts of the police force area and be politically balanced; and members to have the skills, knowledge and experience necessary.
The Panel will review and scrutinise any decisions and other actions taken by the Commissioner on an ongoing basis.
