Exceptional Attendance Awards

Purpose of report

1. The purpose of this report is to seek approval for a civic reception for approximately 30 people, including young people, parents or carers, school representatives and attendance staff, to be held on 13 September 2010 at County Hall.

Information and advice

Background

- 2. The Behaviour and Attendance Service works in partnership with schools to promote, encourage and enforce regular attendance of children of compulsory school age across the county.
- 3. Each year those exceptional students who have achieved 100% attendance during their five years in secondary education are invited to receive an award from the Chairman of the County Council in recognition of this achievement.
- 4. The format of the reception would be a welcome by a representative of the County Council, brief speeches by the Chairman of the County Council followed by the Cabinet Member for Children and Young People's Services. This reception will be held on 13 September 2010 at County Hall.
