ADULT LEARNERS' WEEK CELEBRATION

Purpose of the Report

1. The purpose of this report is to seek approval to hold a celebration event on May 19th as part of Adult Learners' Week 2010.

Information and Advice

- Adult Learners' Week is the UK's largest celebration of learning. It
 promotes education and training for adults, provides access to information
 and guidance, motivates and celebrates their learning achievements.
 Started in 1992, it is a collaborative venture between education and
 training providers, broadcasters and national and local government.
- 3. With its nationwide promotional campaign and high profile activities, Adult Learners' Week offers organisations like the County Council a framework to promote our learning provision. This is the 19th year that Adult Learners' Week has been celebrated in the UK. Further information on Adult Learners' Week is available on www.niace.org.uk/alw

Adult and Community Learning Service (ACLS)

- 4. ACLS supports over 8,000 learners a year throughout Nottinghamshire. For many, this represents the first step back into learning in a long time. For others, it is the first time that they have received a certificate or been commended on their achievements. Through its work with partners, individuals and communities, ACLS seeks to raise aspirations and celebrating success is a major part of this work.
- 5. ACLS has supported or held a range of celebratory events since its inception in 2001 and from 2005 has organised an evening's Adult

Learners' Awards ceremony, all held at County Hall. The positive feedback received from learners and their supporting organisations confirmed the success of the events and highlighted the fact that for many of our learners the opportunity to visit County Hall signified a very special occasion.

6. The Adult Learners' event will be held in the Assembly Rooms at County Hall during the evening of May 19th. While the exact nature of the activities is currently being discussed by a small planning group, the current thinking is that we will hold an awards and celebration evening, with the opportunity to recognise and applaud the achievements of our learners, tutors and, the efforts and commitment of our learning support staff. We anticipate attracting about 100 learners, tutors and support staff altogether, with approximately 150 participants attending the event.

Expenditure

7. The estimated expenditure is as follows:

Publicity & Marketing materials	300
Buffet (150 x £8 a head)	1200
Refreshments (150 x £1 a head)	150
Framed Certificates	600
Gift Plaques	600
Performing Artists	500
Photography	200
Transport	600
Estimated Total	£4150

This sum can be met from the ACLS budget from the Nottinghamshire Learning and Skills Council. A significant number of learners attending the evening will have learning difficulties and/or disabilities and will require support with transport costs, included in the estimate.
