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

# 2010-13 Strategy

- Reducing the Number of Young People Experiencing Custody, both on remand and sentence

# First Time Entrants

- Partnership Effort
- Continued investment of prevention
- Restorative justice and community resolution
- Communities more tolerant of “adolescent” behaviour

# Re-offending

	2009	2010	2011
Percentage of young people re-offending	30.7%	27.1%	29.3%

# Re-offending

- Smaller, more entrenched pool of offenders
- Improved “offender management” strategies
- Drive to improve parenting, NEET and housing to support further reductions



# Violence

	2009	2010	2011
Number of young people committing a violent crime	495	513	395



# Violence

- Year to date – a further 16% reduction on the same period last year
- Success depends on wider approaches to
  - Alcohol
  - Community safety education
  - Emotional literacy

# Custody

	2009	2010	12011
custodial sentence	51	38	32
custodial remand	33	26	21



# Custody

- From 2013 council takes on cost of all custodial remands
- Up to £620 per night per remandee
- Continue to invest in resettlement provision
- Reviewing how we improve compliance with community sentences
