Domestic abuse in Nottinghamshire

Domestic abuse in Nottinghamshire

₿ = 1,000 people

790,000 people live in Nottinghamshire 157,000 can expect to experience domestic abuse or violence in their lifetime 27,400 can expect to experience domestic abuse or violence in any one year 3 or 4 people are killed each year in Nottinghamshire as a result of domestic abuse







Domestic abuse in Nottinghamshire

- 27,400 adults can expect to experience DVA in one year = 67% women & 33% men
- 75% of children & young people witness DVA
- 15 domestic homicides since 2011
- 21% of DVA incidents are reported to the Police







Cost of domestic violence & abuse & return on investment of services

- Economic cost of DVA in Nottinghamshire is estimated to exceed £79m pa
- Audit commission (2011) estimates cost of DVA £20k pa per case over one year
- For every £1 spent on MARACs, £6 of public money can be saved annually







Providers and approach

- One county-wide approach
- Two contracts
- Three providers
- WAIS & NWAL subcontract male survivor service & workforce development to Equation







Service delivery model

- Risk & needs led, trauma informed, strengths based approach
- Female adults one to one support, drop ins, Freedom Programme, Hands are Not for Hurting
- Male adults one to one support
- Teenagers one to one & group support
- Children & young people one to one & group support, Hands are Not for Hurting










Level of risk



Survivor outcomes

- 9 in 10 adult survivors were better informed about their support options
- 8 in 10 adult survivors were safer
- 7 in 10 adult survivors reported improved emotional wellbeing
- 9 in 10 mothers reported that their children had improved emotional wellbeing







Workforce development

- Equation is subcontracted to provide DVA training across the county
- In Year 1, 28 multi agency courses attended by 453 participants
- Training complies with NICE PH50
- Sessions on coercive control, working with perpetrators, MARACs & HBV
