Technology needs to support all of these gaps and should be a "golden thread" throughout





- CCG led: Vicky Bailey Senior Responsible Owner (SRO)




Digital Maturity Assessments

Annual process and linked to **potential funding** as part of the Developing Digital Maturity Fund

Development started November 2015



What is the Local Digital Roadmap (LDR)

- Supports and underpins the Sustainability Transformation Plan (STP)
- Is the plan for delivering the "Digital" agenda set out by the National Informatics Board



Key delivery areas

- Detailing progress against a set of Universal Capabilities
- Demonstrates support for the ambitions of the STP
- Achievement of paperless at the point of care by 2020
- Citizen access to health and care records by 2020 (health by 2018)



Key delivery areas

- Infrastructure to support efficient working practices and information sharing
- Information sharing to support new integrated models of care improving health and well being, care and quality plus cost and efficiency
- *Electronic communications* to support transfers of care and the flow of care improving care and quality plus cost and efficiency
- Making care records available to support self care

Key delivery areas

- Managing variation in digital maturity essential in driving the digital agenda
- Organisations are at different levels of maturity in adoption/use (change management)
- A greater rate of adoption of new technology required in some areas

What next?

- Digital Roadmap submitted in June along with STP (published in August?)
- Recommendations:
 - NOTE the content of the paper and the work that is underway
 - NOTE the content of the presentation to the Health and Well Being Board at the meeting
