4. MEMBERSHIP AND TERMS OF REFERENCE

5. HIGHWAYS REVIEW AND DEVELOPMENT WORK PROGRAMME

The report proposed a comprehensive review programme of 4 key aspects of the highways service, to be considered in the following order:

Innovation

- To review the current use of information and communication technology in the highways service including use of the Highway Asset Management System, data collection systems, communication interfaces and reporting / feedback mechanisms.
- To review the use of the latest plant and materials in delivering the highway service including the use of new repair techniques, data capture at point of service delivery and use of recycled materials.
- To review the approach to other areas of innovation and to consider the County Council's approach for bidding for funding for the trialling and testing of new innovations in the highway sector.

Road Safety

- To review our current approach to casualty reduction through education, engineering and enforcement.
- To provide information on and review current road safety education programme strands and explore how these can be extended to incorporate the adult cohort and Occupational Road Risk.
- To consider progress towards the road casualty reduction targets set nationally and locally for 2020 and explore the vision beyond 2020 for Nottinghamshire

The Integrated Transport Measures Programme

- To review the current elements of the programme in terms of demand, programme inclusion and delivered outcomes.
- To consider how the future elements of the programme align with the Local Transport Plan and the ambitions of the County Council.

 To review our approach to joint funding of projects and working with key partners.

Highways Asset Management, including Highway Inspections and Repair Criteria

- To consider the County Council's Highway Infrastructure Asset Management Plan and use of the Asset Management System to include a review of highway surveys used for road condition performance indicators and the County Council's Highway Inspection and Risk Manual.
- To review the current elements of the capital programme in terms of demand, programme inclusion and delivered outcomes.
- To review our approach to the Department for Transport's incentive fund and future developments in Highway Asset Management, including how we communicate our approach to the local community.

REPORT OF THE CORPORATE DIRECTOR, PLACE

HIGHWAYS INNOVATION

Purpose of the Report

- 1. To seek Members approval for the programme of innovations proposed by the County Council and its contractor Via EM Ltd.
- 2. To seek Members endorsement of the current approach to highways related professional and sector networking.
- 3. To seek Members endorsement for officers to pursue notable funding opportunities for the use of new technology and innovation,

Information

- 4. This meeting will build upon the information previously presented to the Communities and Place Review and Development Committee.
- 5. Although the information presented to Members will place an emphasis upon developments carried out by Via EM Ltd, it should be noted that highways had a strong history of innovation whilst the service was still being delivered in-house for example:
 - The introduction of the CONFIRM highway asset management system.
 - The deployment of interactive traffic management signs.
 - The use of innovative surfacing materials and plastic kerbs.
 - The development of a form of Term Maintenance Contract which was adopted by the Highway Maintenance Efficiency Programme (HMEP) and rolled out nationally for use by other highway authorities.

Liaison with Other Organisations.

- 6. Both the County Council and Via EM Ltd. participate in a number of regional and national organisations to ensure that Nottinghamshire has full sight of highways innovations, these bodies include:
 - The Association of Directors of Environment, Economy, Planning and Transport
 - The Midlands Service Improvement Group
 - Midlands Highway Alliance

- Highways UK
- The Association for Public Service Excellence
- The Highway Term Maintenance Association
- Business in the Community
- Road Safety GB

In addition to the organisations listed above Via EM Ltd. also liaises closely with its strategic surfacing partner Tarmac Ltd. who are internationally renowned for their many innovative products.

7. The County Council in partnership with Via EM and 13 other partners recently submitted a bid to The Association of Directors of Environment, Economy, Planning and Transport seeking to build on the roll out of EV charging points, LED lighting, infrastructure improvement programmes & trials of patching techniques in Nottinghamshire. The bid sought to install a long range wireless access network in the town of Mansfield to create a smart street lighting network, and help deliver pot hole detection, improved traffic monitoring, on street & car park management, flood risk detection, road temperature monitoring and smart flashing amber warning signals.

Innovations to be Presented at this Meeting

- 8. The topics which will be presented to Members at this meeting will be:
 - Targeted gully cleaning
 - Electronic Works Management systems
 - Self-provision of temporary traffic management

These innovations have been selected because they demonstrate initiatives in three stages of development i.e. initial assessment of viability, project development and adoption.

9. Where possible Via EM Ltd. will attempt to illustrate these topics with videos or demonstrations.

Innovations to be presented at future meetings.

10. It is proposed that the following topics will be presented at the March 2019 meeting:

- Artemis, claims recovery service
- Recycling of highway waste and arisings
- Salix bid for replacing street light lanterns with LEDs units
- Innovative patching techniques
- 11. The topics presented to the next meeting are subject to Members approval and if Members wish to discuss alternative topics the meeting agenda will be amended accordingly

Other Options Considered

12. Failure to innovate will result in the County Council being unable to make use of new materials, new ways of working and new technologies, this will prevent improvements being made to the delivery of highway services and these service's value for money.

Reason/s for Recommendation/s

13. The proposed programme of highways innovations will improve the value for money and quality of highway services delivered to the people of Nottinghamshire.

14. This report has been compiled after consideration of implications in respect of crime and disorder, data protection and information governance finance, human resources, human rights, the NHS Constitution (public health services), the public sector equality duty, safeguarding of children and adults at risk, service users, smarter working, sustainability and the environment and where such implications are material they are described below.
