Report of the Chair of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Adults Select Committee

Purpose of the report

1. To introduce Lionel Anthony, Regulation Manager for the Commission for Social Care Inspection (CSCI).

Background

2. The Overview and Scrutiny Committee at its meeting on February 18 2008 commissioned a Select Committee to contribute to policy development within the safeguarding vulnerable adults' agenda. It would consider the impact of the wider safeguarding remit and if policies and procedures/services reflect the requirements of forthcoming legislation.
3. At its first meeting the Select Committee received an initial presentation by departmental officers which provided information concerning the arrangements in Nottinghamshire for safeguarding vulnerable adults. This included details about the move from Adult Protection to Safeguarding Adults and the establishment of separate safeguarding arrangements for the City and the County. The implications of the Mental Capacity Act (MCA) 2005 and the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006 were also discussed.
4. The Select Committee focused on the role of partners at the meeting on the 2 June. Representatives from Nottinghamshire tPCT and Nottinghamshire Police attended and informed Members about their responsibilities and procedures for the safeguarding of vulnerable adults; they also discussed what they considered to be the key issues. Members also learnt about the Mental Capacity Act, the plans in place for its implementation in Nottinghamshire and a brief overview of the Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards.

Issues

5. Lionel Anthony, Regulation Manager for Commission for Social Care Inspection (CSCI), will be informing the Select Committee about its role in inspecting local authorities and how it works to promote the protection of people who use care services. CSCI regulates, inspects and reviews all social care services in the public, private and voluntary sectors in England. They are an independent body set up by the Government to promote improvements in social care and promote good practice.

Recommendations

1. It is recommended that the Safeguarding Vulnerable Adults Select Committee –
 - consider and ask questions regarding the information provided to the Select Committee.
