RESOLVED 2012/008

- 1) That the requirements to undertake a tender for community based social care services be noted.

7. <u>ST AUGUSTINE'S COMMUNITY INFANT AND NURSERY AND ST</u> <u>AUGUSTINE'S COMMUNITY JUNIOR SCHOOLS, WORKSOP –</u> <u>POSSIBLE AMALGAMATION</u>

RESOLVED 2012/011

That the publication of a statuary notice be agreed, under the provisions of sections 11 and 15 of the Education & Inspections Act 2006 for the proposal to amalgamate St Augustine's Infant and Nursery School and St Augustine's Junior School to form a single 3 - 11 years community primary and nursery school, in existing accommodation, from January 2013 at the earliest.

8. LOCAL IMPROVEMENT SCHEME PROGRAMME 2011/12 and 2012/13

RESOLVED 2012/012

That the 2012/13 programme be approved as set out in paragraph 19 of the report and detailed in the appendices attached to the report.

9. <u>NEW RATES FOR INDEPENDENT SECTOR CARE HOMES,</u> <u>HOMECARE AND OTHER COMMUNITY – BASED SUPPORT</u> <u>SERVICES, AND NEW CHARGES FOR SERVICES FOR THE YEAR</u> <u>2012/13</u>

RESOLVED 2012/013

- That approval be given to the Corporate Director for Adult Social Care, Health and Public Protection, or his nominee, being authorised to implement rates of increase within the allocated £1.2 million envelope, as outlined in paragraph 13 of the report, for the final phase of the Local Fair Price for Care fee structure to incentivise care quality and provider performance.
- 2) That it be noted that in accordance with the decisions made by Cabinet on 9th March 2011 in relation to fees for 2012/13 :
 - a) the levels of payment to providers of supported living services to adults with learning disabilities be retained at the 2011/12 rate.

- b) the levels of payments to independent sector providers for other community – based support services, including home care and extra care be retained at the 2011/12 rates.
- c) the levels of payment for specialist care home placements be retained at the 2011/12 rates.
- 3) That in relation to the decisions made by Cabinet on 9th March 2011 regarding charges for 2012/13 :
 - a) the charge to self funders who fund their own care in Nottinghamshire County Council Care Homes is increased to £650 per week from April 2012.
 - b) the charges to service users for meals provision to be retained at the 2011/12 rates.
 - c) the charges for transport to service users to be retained at the 2011/12 rate.

10. <u>PROPOSALS TO INCREASE THE SUPPLY OF PRIMARY SCHOOL</u> <u>PLACES IN WEST BRIDGFORD</u>

RESOLVED 2012/014

That it be agreed to increase the number of primary school places, in line with demand demonstrated by Basic Need, and to meet the DfE recommendation of 5% unfilled places to support parental preference by:

- a) consulting on the expansion of Heymann Primary School to increase capacity from 420 to 630 places across two sites and develop plans to build on the newly proposed site in central West Bridgford to ensure provision is available in 2013/14.
- a) ratifying the provision of an additional classroom at Jesse Gray Primary School to facilitate the two bulge years that are currently being accommodated and agree that the school will revert to its original capacity of 420 places in 2018.
- b) working with Pierrepont Gamston VA Primary School and the Southwell Church of England Diocese to explore options for expansion by a further 105 places and bring a further report to Cabinet or the appropriate committee with proposals as soon as possible.
- c) working with Lady Bay Primary School to consider options for development, including replacement of the double mobile with permanent accommodation and bring a further report to Cabinet or the appropriate committee with proposals as soon as possible
- e) exploring the option of expanding Edwalton Primary School in the longer term and removing temporary mobile classrooms

f) consulting on potential change to the catchment area arrangements of the schools affected.

11. FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS IN POST – 16 EDUCATION

RESOLVED 2012/015

That during the year 1st April 2012 – 31st March 2013 regulation 3 (1) of the Local Education Authority (Post – Compulsory Education Awards) (Amendment) (England) Regulations 2000 shall not apply to Nottinghamshire County Council and that in consequence the County Council will have no powers to make post – compulsory education awards to post-16 students entering new courses in schools or in further or higher education in 2012/13 in any circumstances.

RESOLVED 2012/017

That Bassetlaw District Council be advised that whilst the principle of such development in terms of strategic and national renewable energy policy is supported, Nottinghamshire County Council objects to the proposal owing to the significant concerns over its potential impact, as yet undetermined, on the ecology and the unacceptable impact on the landscape of the county.
