1 **Welcome and Introduction**

Cllr Glynn Gilfoyle welcomed everyone to the meeting, aimed at updating Members on key areas of development within the Communities Department.

2 **Apologies**

Apologies were received from Cllr Mark Spencer and Cllr Parry Tsimbiridis.

3 Minutes of the previous meeting 15 January 2008

These were approved.

4 Communities Department Business Plan

Mick Burrows gave an overview of the three year 2008/11 Plan, highlighting:

- The vision and values set out.
- Increased emphasis around partnerships & partnership working.
- The matrix showing aligned priorities with themes of the Nottinghamshire Partnership and departmental/service objectives.

Mick thanked everyone who contributed to the Plan and asked if Members had any questions.

Discussion

Cllr Barnes Sherwood Forest Ollerton roundabout – will cash be

available to undertake work?

Cllr Smedley There has been tremendous increase in spending but sadly

not enough money to undertake all. Increased housing has knock on effects on provision of more roads but with money

we have, doing first rate job.

Cllr Jen Cole Echoed that Higways' statistics were excellent and reflected

amount of work being undertaken.

Cllr B Laughton Ollerton roundabout a priority and concerned that area of

serious congestion will affect flow of movement by people.

Can we start future planning on this?

BH Recognised traffic growth inevitable and have plans to

address. Civil parking enforcement comes in 12 May and

will help alleviate problems.

SC Local Transport Plan – more money being invested.

Cllr Gilfoyle We have achieved a great deal & lots to look forward to eg

Worksop CHUB.

Cllr R Adair Can management deliver?

Cllr Gilfoyle Yes – what we have set out we have budget to achieve and

believe it is deliverable.

MB Key objectives (page 24) underpinned by management

plans, links to 198 indicators we will be judged by

Government. Whilst we lost the lottery bid, Sherwood Forest

Plan B underway.

Cllr Smedley A lot of projects in Business Plan already started. Aims to

fulfil needs of all as everyone has stake in this.

Cllr Carroll 5 Libraries to be completed by December 08 and work

starting in next few weeks on West Bridgford Club.

MB 'You and Your Community' – evolving document.

Clirs Lally/Gilfoyle Thanked all involved in producing and receiving plan.

5 Climate Change

Cllr Stocks introduced the report and Kate Revell gave a presentation on our response by the Planning & Sustainability Team to climate change and carbon management. Cllr Stocks commended the team for their work to date.

Kate reminded all that NCC had won the 2005 Beacon Award for Sustainable Energy. 'Everybody's Talking about Climate Change' campaign in conjunction with Derbyshire. Progressing LAA climate change indicator through new partnership – launch 19 May. Kate reminded everyone that there was a range of informative materials available today to take away.

Discussion

Cllr Cutts Difficult to equate presentation with what is actually

happening. Some villages have no way to feed in their own ideas. Concerned about concreting over county & removing

green areas.

Cllr Gilfloyle People want affordable housing.

Kate Revell Review concluded that climate change is happening. £500m

has come from central Government into 'Invest to Save'

scheme.

Bob Hart Street lights – Lighting Scrutiny looking at various

issues/initiatives. Flooding – 4 new pumps bought plus drainage vehicles. Working with Leicestershire/Derbyshire

on how we can react better.

Cllr Cutts Concerned about repairs to school buildings.

Cllr Gilfoyle Risk register prioritises who will have work done first.

Cllr Smedley Schools are rewarded when they show savings.

Steve Calvert Can influence new housing re layout by liaising with District

Council's for sustainable housing.

Cllr Creamer More people are paving over gardens. Can we have input to

suggest alternatives ie soak away or more sustainable

paving?

Clir J Cole Agreed that unfortunately we are the cause of problem here

and not global warming so important to adopt strategies and highlighted the 'Living for Tomorrow' magazine as excellent

idea.

Cllr Brandon Bravo Cited ability/inability of Trent to take water away fast enough.

Environment Agency saying dredging not economic however Cllr B feels we need to get them to rethink as riverbed is just being allowed to rise and that it's simply the Agency saying it

is not economic for them to undertake.

Cllr Smedley Has sympathy with comment plus rivers/canals would benefit

commercially from more dredging.

Bob Hart We and Emergency Planning liaise regularly with

Environment Agency.

Cllr Brandon Bravo Suggested we give to new Regional Minister to tackle.

Richard Hodge Agency keener to work with us and looking at implications of

flooding. RH wants to get Environment Agency in to meet Members and discuss issues & how they are taking wider

role in future.

Kate Revell We are working closely with agency proactively re

adaptations/planning consultation in respect of flooding.

Cllr Gilfoyle Would like Agency to simulate situation to show if increased

dredging effective.

Cllr Lally Vital to address. Do we calculate tonnage of carbon savings

usage?

Kate Revell Trying to monitor.

Cllr Reg Adair Feels that recycling not advancing as much as others in

some areas and room for improvement within waste

management in Notts. Discussion ensued around bio fuels

and how we square.

Jas Hundal Acknowledged we need to do more on waste management.

Trying to get companies to reduce packaging. We are one of the highest authorities for recycling and should exceed our

recovery rates/targets this year from EEC figures.

Kate Revell Need to reduce NCC/staff travel. Bio fuels – often NCC

haven't any choice in choosing. Wood heat is positive.

Bob Hart Highways looked at bio fuels for use in their fleet vehicles

but engines often not compatible.

Cllr Petengell Had tried out wood heat in local school but had to take out

because of running cost.

Cllr Barnes Felt people too wasteful and threw away too much food.

Cllr Cutts Noted that we were still stocking French apples in NCC Tuck

shop.

Kate Revell NCC campaigns always trying to encourage people to be

thrifty.

In summing up Cllr Stocks thanked Kate for the presentation and acknowledged the concerns and comments expressed by Cllrs on our contribution to greenhouse gases. He is keen to work in schools so that children take the message home. Need to involve secondary schools level in Eco schools concept – providing schools with recognition for environment achievement.

Acknowledged that whilst originally discretionary work for Local Authorities, now on our targets. Attention needs to be made to existing housing. Whilst we have helped a number of schools with associated higher costs in relation to installing/running new boilers, the caretakers' time is considerably reduced as a consequence.

Cllr Gilfoyle closed by thanking everyone for their engagement and recognised that we can all do better as individuals and as an Authority.
