3.4	Cllr Brandon Bravo raised concerns about the scheduling of different sets of roadworks that impact on a particular area at the same time and suggested that communication and scheduling could be better.	
4.0	Regeneration – The Strategic Direction	
	Cllr Steve Carroll gave a presentation on the priorities for Regeneration. Celia Morris, Geoff George, Caroline Agnew and Sue Green were present to answer questions.	
4.1	Cllr Mark Spencer suggested that procurement of products closer to home could help local businesses and would be more sustainable. Cllr Stocks said it was a question of getting the balance right between price, quality and protecting the environment.	
4.2	Cllr Kay Cutts asked whether there was help available for school leavers who leave school without jobs or qualifications. Cllr Steve Carroll said that he was aware of gaps and was keen to work more with Children & Young People to develop this area further.	S Carroll

	Cllr Stella Smedley provided Members with an update on the current management plan and developments within Highways and outlined ongoing issues and proposals for future work.	
5.1	Cllrs Saddington and Stewart raised an issue about the development of a mini roundabout on the A616 and access to the sugar factory. Bob Hart will look into this.	ВН
5.2	Cllr Mark Spencer asked what progress had been made on looking at the cost saving of turning street lights off at midnight. Cllr Smedley said that the Department was currently looking at the impact but there are road safety issues.

5.4	Cllr Jen Cole asked whose responsibility it was to let the public know about roadworks. Cllr Smedley said that a lot of work was
