Introduction

- Home Office has linked the domestic and sexual abuse and violence agendas
- Sexual abuse has recently been included in the partnership work of the SNB
- Primarily adult services child sexual abuse is responsibility of the Safeguarding Children's Board
- Cross-cutting area of work involving a wide number of partners and issues

Sexual abuse data

 Widely underreported: Estimate of 1 in 10 incidents are reported to the police

In Nottinghamshire

- In 2012/13, 931 sexual offences
- Since 2009, 88% female and 12% male victims
- Districts: Mansfield highest numbers / Rushcliffe lowest
- 71% of victims are aged 24 and under

- Specialist support for young people aged 13/14+
- Domestic abuse services support sexual abuse within intimate relationships
 - at least 30% of sexual abuse
- Managing and supporting sex offenders

2013 Strategy Development

Work was commissioned to:

- Scope the current provision of sexual abuse services in the county
- Consult with stakeholders and SNB partners on current and future priorities
- Identify future priorities for the development of sexual abuse services across the county
- Make recommendations based on the findings

Key Issues Identified

From Stakeholder consultation, 5 Key Issues were identified:

- Young people's services
- Waiting lists and service capacity
- Partnership working
- Awareness raising: public and professionals
- Trafficking and sexual exploitation

Next Steps

- Consultation is underway with stakeholders
 - draft recommendations based on the 5 key issues
- Performance framework development
- Service User Consultation
- Strategy will be developed and brought jointly to the January Committee and SNB for approval
