A Monthly Analysis of Employment, Unemployment and Jobs

August 2012

Unemployment according to the Government's preferred measure was 2.59 million in the three months to July 2012, down 7,000 on the previous three months but up 61,000 on the same period a year ago. The unemployment rate was 8.1%, down 0.1 from the previous three months but up 0.1 from a year earlier.

The unemployment rate for 16-24 year olds was 21.6% in the three months to July 2012, down 0.2 from the previous three months. There were 1,020,000 unemployed 16-24 year olds in the three months to July 2012, up 7,000 from the three months to April 2012.

The seasonally adjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom decreased by 15,000 last month to 1,570,500 and was down 3,600 over the year.

The number of people in employment aged 16 to 64 increased by 236,000 over the quarter to reach 29.56 million,

this figure was up 431,000 on a year earlier.

The number of people in full-time employment increased by 102,000 on the quarter to reach 21.44 million. The number of people in part-time employment was 8.12 million in the three months to July 2012,


up 134,000 on the previous quarter.

Average total pay (including bonuses) was £471 per week in July 2012. In the three months to July 2012 total pay rose by 1.5% on a year earlier, down 0.3 from the three months to June.

Average regular pay (excluding bonuses) was £443 per week in July 2012. In the three months to July 2012 regular pay rose by 1.9% on a year earlier, up 0.1 from the three months to June.

There were 473,000 job vacancies in the three months to August 2012, up 5,000 from the three months to May 2012 and up 14,000 on a year earlier.

There were 1.8 vacancies per 100 employee jobs in the



three months to August 2012, unchanged on the previous quarter but up 0.1 the year.


In the three months to July 2012, 142,000 people became redundant in the three months prior to their Labour Force Survey interview. This is down 13,000 from the previous three months and down 20,000 on the year. The redundancy rate was 5.7 per 1,000 employees, down 0.5 from the previous three months and down 0.8 from a year earlier.

The unadjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom has decreased by 2,746 over the month to 1,569,926. The proportion unemployed calculated on the residence base now stands at 3.9% of the population aged 16-64.




Figure 1 illustrates the trend in the number of NINo allocations for both total registrations and for those people originating from the A8 countries since 2004/05. It can be seen that the number of NINo allocations to people coming from the A8 countries has reduced slightly in the last year after showing an increase the previous year after a continuing decrease since its peak of 4,120 allocations in

The number of claimants in Nottinghamshire decreased by 115 between July and August 2012. The total of 30,677 is 490 more than it was a year ago (see figure 1).

The proportion unemployed in Nottinghamshire is now 4.3%. This is higher than the East Midlands (3.7%) and the United Kingdom (3.9%).

Between July and August 2012, unemployment decreased in three of the four Travel To Work Areas in the County (figure 2). Mansfield experienced the largest decrease, with a rate of change of -1.8%, followed by Nottingham with -0.3% and



Lincoln with -0.1%. Worksop & Retford experienced a small increase over the month resulting in a rate of change of 3.1%.

Compared with August 2011, two of the four TTWA's in County have increased of numbers claimants. largest changes have been in Lincoln with a rate of change of 7.6%. Worksop & Retford had a rate of change of 0.7%. Mansfield and Nottingham had fewer claimants than last year resulting in rates of change of -1.0% and -0.2% respectively.

Unemployment decreased in four of the seven Local Authority Districts in the County between July and August 2012. The largest changes were in Rushcliffe and Newark & Sherwood which both experienced a rate of change of -3.3%, Broxtowe with -1.8% and Ashfield with -0.9%.

Unemployment in the City of Nottingham increased by 33 over the month resulting in a rate of change of 0.2%.

The rates of change have varied throughout the County over the year, from -11.9% in Rushcliffe to 6.9% in Ashfield. Nottingham City has changed by 2.7% over the year.

Unemployment decreased in six of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County during August. Rushcliffe recorded the largest decrease experiencing a rate of change of -3.3% followed by Ashfield and Mansfield with -2.3% and -2.0% respectively. Over the month Nottingham East has changed by 0.7%, Nottingham North by -0.7% and Nottingham South by 0.8%.

Most Parliamentary Constituencies in the County have increased numbers of claimants compared with the

same period last year with the exceptions of Rushcliffe which had a change of -11.9% and Broxtowe with -3.4%. Newark and Ashfield have the largest increases, experiencing rates of change of 6.9% and 5.0% respectively. The three Nottingham Constituencies have rates of change of 3.4%

in Nottingham East, 1.9% in Nottingham North and 2.6% in Nottingham South.




New Disclosure Control Procedures with JSA Claimant Count Data

A new disclosure control procedure has been introduced with JSA claimant count data on NOMIS with effect from 15th November. The procedure follows an interim review of the confidentiality of JSA claimant count data, and is required for compliance with the National Statistics Code of Practice for Data Access and Confidentiality. This is an interim measure pending a thorough assessment of the risk to the confidentiality of claimant count data early next year.

The procedure is the primary suppression of any cell count of 1 or 2, which is instead denoted by the symbol '#'. A true value of zero continues to be shown as 0.


National Insurance Number allocations to overseas nationals entering the UK - 2011/12

This report provides statistics regarding National Insurance Numbers (NINo) allocated to adult overseas nationals entering the United Kingdom during the financial year 2011/12 as released by the Department for Work and Pensions on 30th August 2012.

A NINo is generally required by any overseas national looking to work or claim benefits/tax credits in the UK, including the self employed or students working part time.

The figures provide a measure of in-migration but do not reflect emigration or the overall migrant population.

The figures reflect adult overseas nationals allocated a NINo through the adult reaistration scheme. addition there will be a small number of overseas nationals (aged 16-19 years) allocated a NINo automatically through the Juvenile Registration scheme. This occurs when the



individual has previously been allocated a child registration number. These juvenile cases are not captured by the statistics.

Nationally, the total number of NINo registrations to adult overseas nationals entering the UK in 2011/12 was 601 thousand, a fall of 104 thousand (15%) on the previous year.

A reduction was also

e x p e r i e n c e d i n Nottinghamshire where there were 2,890 NINo allocations to non-UK nationals living in the County in 2011/12. This is down by 200 from the previous year, a fall of 6.5%.

Of the total, 1,820 or almost 63% were from the 'Accession 8' or 'A8' countries which joined the European Union in 2004. This is down by 20 over the year.

2006/07.

The NINo data contains details of the district in which people were living when they registered and this is shown in Table 1.

Of the total 2,890 NINo registrations in the County in 2011/12, the largest proportion (26.0%) were living in Mansfield. This is followed by Newark & Sherwood with 20.4% and Broxtowe 19.0%.

Figure 2 shows NINo registrations by country of origin. As can be seen, the largest number of people (950) from any one country originate from Poland. This is up from 940 in the previous year and represents almost 33% of all registrations in the county. The Republic of Lithuania is second with 340 registrations and the Republic of Latvia is third with 290. Registrations Lithuania are down from 360 last year and Latvia is down also from 360. Hungary has 160 registrations, up from 100 last year. There were 100 registrations by people from India, down from 160 last year. The remaining 36% is made up from registrations of people from all other countries.

A similar pattern is

evident at the district level. In Bassetlaw for example, almost 57% of all NINo registrations were from people originating from Poland. For the other districts in the County the comparable figures are: Mansfield 53%, Ashfield 39%, Newark & Sherwood 27%, Gedling 21%, Rushcliffe 9% and Broxtowe 6%.

Over 89% of NINo registrations in Mansfield, 80% in Newark & Sherwood and over two thirds of registrations in Ashfield and Bassetlaw were from people originating from the A8 countries.

Broxtowe and to a lesser extent Rushcliffe show a different pattern by having registrations from people who originate from a broader spread of countries.

In Broxtowe, only 5% of registrations were from people originating from Poland whilst 9% were from China and 18% from Hungary.

In Rushcliffe, the largest proportion of people from any one country originated from India which accounted for just over 14% of the total.

In total for the County there were 210 registrations from people from Lithuania. Interestingly, 200 or over 95% were in Newark & Sherwood.

Overall, Broxtowe had registrations from people originating from 28 different countries, followed by Newark & Sherwood 13, Rushcliffe 12, Bassetlaw 11, Ashfield 9, Gedling 7 and Mansfield 6.

The information contained in this report concentrates on the area covered by the County Council, but readers may be interested to know that there were more NINo registrations Nottingham City than in the whole of the rest Nottinghamshire. There were 4,970 registrations Nottingham, down from 5,440 last year. The registrations came from people originating from 76 different countries.

Of the total number of NINo registrations in Nottingham, 25% were from Poland, 13% from Pakistan, 8% from India, 4% from Lithuania and 4% from China.
