

# Pathway To Integrated Services V.2 - April 2009

## Our Vision

**We will work together to provide integrated services for all children and young people in Nottinghamshire aged 0-19 to improve their life chances and to help them maximise their potential.**

To enable us to deliver our vision to improve outcomes for children and young people and their families, we are developing a range of locally accessible and integrated services, supported by clear signposting, along with common management arrangements and systems.

### PHASE

#### Collaboration

Partnership agreement to:

- work towards a child and family centred, outcome led vision
- establish robust inter-agency governance arrangements
- use an integrated strategy for planning and commissioning
- develop shared language and common processes across our services
- continue the roll-out of our early intervention and targetted support model using Joint Access Teams (JAT)
- establish Test Beds for models of service delivery including infrastructure and governance
  - Newark & Sherwood
  - Ashfield
  - Early Support Development
  - 'Healthy Child'

#### Co-ownership

- Using the Test Bed evaluation to develop an accommodation strategy involving services aligned around existing key office bases
  - Meadow House (Ashfield/Mansfield)
  - Sir John Robinson Way (Broxtowe, Gedling, Rushcliffe)
  - Ollerton Energy Village (Bassetlaw, Newark & Sherwood)
- Development of satellite (touch down) facilities in other key locations
- Appropriate functions in co-located teams (CYPS and multi-agency) embedding our arrangements for:
  - Team around the child and family
  - Joint Access Teams to co-ordinate early intervention/targetted support
  - Individual service based initiatives (i.e. FIP, YISP etc)
  - 7 sub groups of LSP to lead district wide needs assessment, resource deployment and commissioning
- Infrastructure and governance in place to support locality working
- Policies and systems revised to support locality arrangements
  - Services based around 3 key areas:
    - Broxtowe, Gedling, Rushcliffe
    - Ashfield/Mansfield
    - Bassetlaw/Newark & Sherwood
