February 2015

Unemployment according to the Government's preferred measure was 1.86 million in the three months to January 2015, down 102,000 from the previous three months and down 479,000 from the same period a year ago. The unemployment rate was 5.7%, down 0.3 from the previous three months and down 1.5 from a year earlier.


The unemployment rate for 16-24 year olds was 16.2% in the three months to January 2015, down by 0.4% on the guarter and down 3.6% on the There were 743,000 year. unemployed young people aged from 16 to 24 in the guarter to January 2015. This is down by 12,000 on the quarter and down by 181,000 over the year. Comparisons of youth unemployment over time are complicated by the fact that unemployment rates are calculated as the number of unemployed people divided by the economically active



population which excludes those not seeking or available for work. The proportion of people aged from 16 to 24 in full-time education has increased substantially from 26.2% for March to May 1992 to 43.4% for the three months ending January 2015. Unemployment rates are



The seasonally adjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom decreased by 31,000 last month to 791,200 and was down 380,500 over the year.

The number of people in employment aged 16 and over increased by 143,000 over the guarter to reach 30.94 million.

The employment rate for those aged 16 to 64 is now 73.3%, up 0.3 from the previous quarter and up 1.2 from a year earlier.


The number of people in full-time employment increased by 98,000 on the quarter to reach 22.64 million. The number of people in part-time employment was 8.29 million in the three months to January 2015, up 45,000 on the previous quarter.

In the three months to January 2015, there were 9.03 million economically inactive people aged from 16 to 64, down 30,000 from the previous quarter but up 14,000 from a year earlier.

Average total pay (including bonuses) was £483 per week in January 2015. Over the year total pay for employees in Great Britain increased by 1.8%. Average regular pay (excluding bonuses) was £457 per week in January 2015. Over the year regular pay for employees in Great Britain rose by 1.6%. Between January 2014 and January 2015, the Consumer Prices Index increased by 0.3%.

There were 735,000 job vacancies in the three months to February 2015, up 35,000 from the three months to November 2014 and up 140,000 on a year earlier.

There were 2.6 unemployed people per vacancy



in the period from November 2014 to January 2015, down 0.2 on the quarter and down by 1.4 on the year.

In the three months to January 2015, 114,000 people became redundant in the three months prior to their Labour Force Survey interview. This is up 12,000 from the previous three months but down 3,000 on the year. The redundancy rate was 4.4 per 1,000 employees, up 0.4 from the previous three months but down 0.2 from a year earlier.

The unadjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom has increased by 5,410 over the month to 858,344. The proportion unemployed calculated on the residence base now stands at 2.1% of the population aged 16-64.

The number of claimants in Nottinghamshire increased by 403 between January and February 2015. The total of 18,027 is 7,328 less than it was a year ago (see figure 1).

The proportion unemployed in Nottinghamshire is now 2.5%. This is higher than the East Midlands (1.9%) and the United Kingdom (2.1%).

Between January and February 2015, unemployment increased in three of the four Travel To Work Areas in the County (figure 2). Mansfield experienced the largest increase with a rate of change of 4.3%, followed by Nottingham with 2.1% and Lincoln with 0.3%. Worksop & Retford experienced a reduction over the month resulting in a rate of change of -2.6%.

Compared with February 2014, all of the four TTWA's in the County have reduced numbers of claimants. The largest change has been in Worksop & Retford with a rate of

change of -34.2% followed by Lincoln with -31.3%, Mansfield with -30.7% and Nottingham with -27.6%.

U n e m p l o y m e n t increased in five of the seven Local Authority Districts in the County over the month. The largest increases were in Ashfield with 5.3% and Newark & Sherwood with 2.4%. Unemployment in the City of Nottingham increased by 310 over the month resulting in a rate of change of 3.6%.

The rates of change

have varied throughout the County over the year, from -35.2% in Broxtowe to -26.7% in Rushcliffe. Nottingham City changed by -25.7% over the year.

Un employment increased in six of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County during February. Ashfield and Newark recorded the largest increases, experiencing rates of change of 6.7% and 3.8% respectively. Over the month Nottingham East has changed by 3.3%, Nottingham North by 2.6% and Nottingham South by 5.9%.

All of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County have decreased numbers of claimants compared with the same period last year resulting in rates of change ranging from -25.8% in Rushcliffe to -35.6% in Newark. The three Nottingham Constituencies have rates of change of -25.6% in Nottingham East, -27.0% in Nottingham North and -23.9% in Nottingham South.



New Disclosure Control Procedures with JSA Claimant Count Data

The procedure follows an interim review of the confidentiality of JSA claimant count data, and is required for compliance with the National Statistics Code of Practice for Data Access and Confidentiality.

The procedure is the primary suppression of any cell count of 1 or 2, which is instead denoted by the symbol '#'. A true value of zero continues to be shown as 0.
