December 2014

Unemployment according to the Government's preferred measure was 1.91 million in the three months to November 2014, down 58,000 from the previous three months and down 418,000 from the same period a year ago. The unemployment rate was 5.8%, down 0.2 from the previous three months and down 1.3 from a year earlier.

The unemployment rate for 16-24 year olds was 16.9% in the three months to November 2014, up 0.9 on the guarter but down 3.2 on the year. There were 764,000 unemployed young people aged from 16 to 24 in the guarter September to November 2014. This is an increase of 30,000 on the quarter but a reduction of 171,000 over the year. Comparisons of youth unemployment over time are complicated by the fact that unemployment rates are calculated as the number of unemployed people divided by



the economically active population which excludes those not seeking or available for work. The proportion of people aged from 16 to 24 in full-time education has increased substantially from 26.2% for March to May 1992 to 43.7% for August to October 2014.

Increasing numbers of young people going into full-time education reduces the size of the economically active population and therefore increases the unemployment rate. The lowest youth unemployment rate was 11.6% for spring 2001 and the highest rate was 22.5% for winter 2011.

The seasonally adjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom decreased by 29,700 last month to 867,700 and was down 370,800 over the year.

The number of people in employment aged 16 and over increased by 37,000 over the quarter to reach 30.80 million. The employment rate for those aged 16 to 64 is now 73.0%, unchanged from the previous quarter but up 1.0 from a year



earlier.


The number of people in full-time employment increased by 42,000 on the quarter to reach 22.52 million. The number of people in part-time employment was 8.27 million in the three months to November 2014, down 4,000 on the previous quarter.

In the three months to November 2014, there were 9.09 million economically inactive people aged from 16 to 64, up 66,000 from the previous quarter and up 41,000 from a year earlier.

Average total pay (including bonuses) was £483 per week in November 2014. Over the year total pay for employees in Great Britain increased by 1.7%. A v e r a g e regular pay (excluding bonuses) was £455 per week in November 2014. Over the year regular pay for employees in Great Britain rose by 1.8%. Between October 2013 and October 2014, the Consumer Prices Index increased by 1.0%.

There were 700,000 job vacancies in the three months to December 2014, up 19,000 from the three months to September 2014 and up 127,000 on a year earlier.

There were 2.8 unemployed people per vacancy in the period from September to November 2014, down 0.1 on the quarter and down by 1.4 on



the year.

In the three months to November 2014, 103,000 people became redundant in the three months prior to their Labour Force Survey interview. This is up 8,000 from the previous three months but down 9,000 on the year. The redundancy rate was 3.9 per 1,000 employees, up 0.3 from the previous three months but down 0.4 from a year earlier.

The unadjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom has decreased by 24,205 over the month to 823,880. The proportion unemployed calculated on the residence base now stands at 2.0% of the population aged 16-64.

The number of claimants in Nottinghamshire decreased by 469 between November and December 2014. The total of 17,058 is 6,642 less than it was a year ago (see figure 1).

The proportion unemployed in Nottinghamshire is now 2.4%. This is higher than the East Midlands (1.8%) and the United Kingdom (2.0%).

Between November and December 2014, unemployment decreased in all of the four Travel To Work Areas in the County (figure 2). Worksop & Retford experienced the largest decrease with a rate of change of -3.6%, followed by Nottingham with -3.1%, Mansfield -1.8% and Lincoln with -1.4%.

Compared with December 2013, all of the four TTWA's in the County have reduced numbers of claimants. The largest change has been in Worksop & Retford with a rate of change of -31.5% followed by Lincoln with -29.9%, Mansfield with -29.8% and Nottingham with -27.2%.

Unemployment decreased in all of the seven Local Authority

The rates shown in tables 1-4 are supplied by ONS. They are calculated by expressing the claimant count figures as a proportion of the resident population aged 16-64 derived from the latest mid-year population figures.

Districts in the County between November and December 2014. The largest decreases were in Mansfield with -4.1% and Rushcliffe with -3.8%. Unemployment in the City of Nottingham decreased by 253 over the month resulting in a rate of change of -2.9%.

The rates of change have varied throughout the County over the year, from -35.1% in Broxtowe to -27.0% in Gedling. Nottingham City changed by -25.5% over the year.

Un employment decreased in seven of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County during December. Mansfield and Rushcliffe recorded the largest decreases, experiencing rates of change of -4.1% and -3.5% respectively. Ashfield experienced a small increase over the month resulting in a rate of change of 0.6%. Over the month Nottingham East has changed by -4.1%, Nottingham North by -1.7% and Nottingham South by -2.7%.

ΑII of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County have decreased numbers of claimants compared with the same period last year resulting in rates of change ranging from -26.8% in Gedling to -35.4% in The three Broxtowe. Nottingham Constituencies have rates of change of -24.7% in Nottingham East, -26.1% in Nottingham North and -26.0% in Nottingham South.


