A Monthly Analysis of Employment, Unemployment and Jobs

July 2014

Unemployment according to the Government's preferred measure was 2.08million in the three months to June 2014, down 132,000 from the previous three months and down 437,000 from the same period a year ago. The unemployment rate was 6.4%, down 0.4 from the previous three months and down 1.4 from a year earlier.

The unemployment rate for 16-24 year olds was 16.9% in the three months to June 2014, down 2.1 on the quarter. There were 767,000 unemployed young people aged from 16 to 24 in the quarter April to June 2014. This was 102,000 fewer than for January to March 2014 and 206,000 fewer than a year earlier. These were the largest quarterly and annual falls in youth unemployment since comparable records began in 1992.

The seasonally adjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom decreased by 33,600

last month to 1,007,500 and was down 420,600 over the year.


The number of people in employment aged 16 and over increased by 167,000 over the quarter to reach 30.60 million. The employment rate for those aged 16 to 64 is now 73.0%, up

0.3 from the previous quarter and up 1.5 from a year earlier.

The number of people in full-time employment increased by 150,000 on the quarter to reach 22.40 million. The number of people in part-time employment was 8.19 million in the three months to June 2014, up 17,000 on the previous quarter.

In the three months to June 2014, there were 8.86 million economically inactive people aged from 16 to 64, up 15,000 from the previous quarter but down 130,000 from a year earlier.

Average total pay (including bonuses) was £477 per week in June 2014. Over the year total pay for employees in Great Britain fell by 0.2%.


Average regular pay (excluding bonuses) was £450 per week in June 2014. Over the year regular pay for employees in Great Britain rose by 0.6%. This was the lowest annual growth rate since records began in 2001 and reflects low pay growth across a wide range of industrial sectors. Between June 2013 and June 2014, the Consumer Prices Index increased by 1.9%.

There were 656,000 job vacancies in the three months to July 2014, up 19,000 from the three months to April 2014 and up 119,000 on a year earlier.

There were 3.2 unemployed people per vacancy in the period from April to June 2014, down 0.4 on the quarter and down by 1.6 on the year.

In the three months to June 2014, 111,000 people became redundant in the three months prior to their Labour Force Survey interview. This is down 15,000 from the previous three months and down 12,000 on the year. The redundancy rate was 4.3 per 1,000 employees, down 0.6 from the previous three months and down 0.5 from a year earlier.

The unadjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom has decreased by 24,455 over the month to 995,835. The proportion unemployed calculated on the residence base now stands at 2.4% of the



population aged 16-64.

The number of claimants in Nottinghamshire decreased by 435 between June and July 2014. The total of 20,711 is 7,053 less than it was a year ago (see figure 1).

The proportion unemployed in Nottinghamshire is now 2.9%. This is higher than the East Midlands (2.3%) and the United Kingdom (2.4%).

Between June and July 2014, unemployment decreased in all of the four Travel To Work Areas in the County (figure 2). Lincoln experienced the largest decrease, with a rate of change of -3.4%, followed by Nottingham with -2.2%, Mansfield with -1.9% and Worksop & Retford with -1.5%.

Compared with July 2013, all of the four TTWA's in the County have reduced numbers of claimants. The largest change has been in Worksop & Retford

with a rate of change of -26.7% followed by Lincoln with -25.9% and Mansfield and Nottingham both with -25.7%.

Unemployment decreased in five of the seven Local Authority Districts in the County between June and July 2014. The largest decreases were in Newark & Sherwood with -5.1% and Mansfield with -3.0%. Gedling and Rushcliffe had small increases in the number of claimants resulting in rates of change of 0.3% and 1.3% respectively. Unemployment in the City of Nottingham decreased by 268 over the month resulting in a rate of change of -2.6%.

The rates of change have varied throughout the County over the year, from -33.5% in Broxtowe to -23.5% in Mansfield. Nottingham City changed by -21.8% over the year.

The rates shown in tables 1-4 are supplied by ONS. They are calculated by expressing the claimant count figures as a proportion of the resident population aged 16-64 derived from the latest mid-year population figures.

Unemployment decreased in six of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County during July. Newark recorded the largest decrease, experiencing a rate of change of -7.1% followed by Mansfield and Sherwood both with -2.4%. Over the month Nottingham East has changed by -3.1%, Nottingham North by -3.0% and Nottingham South by -1.3%.

All of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in

the County have decreased numbers of claimants compared with the same period last year resulting in rates of change ranging from -23.0% in Mansfield to -33.3% in both Broxtowe and Newark. The three Nottingham Constituencies have rates of change of -19.4% in Nottingham East, -24.9% in Nottingham North and -21.2% in Nottingham South.



New Disclosure Control Procedures with JSA Claimant Count Data

A new disclosure control procedure has been introduced with JSA claimant count data on NOMIS with effect from 15th November. The procedure follows an interim review of the confidentiality of JSA claimant count data, and is required for compliance with the National Statistics Code of Practice for Data Access and Confidentiality. This is an interim measure pending a thorough assessment of the risk to the confidentiality of claimant count data early next year.


The procedure is the primary suppression of any cell count of 1 or 2, which is instead denoted by the symbol '#'. A true value of zero continues to be shown as 0.
