


## **Employment Bulletin**

A Monthly Analysis of Employment, Unemployment and Jobs

### January 2014

Unemployment according to the Government's preferred measure was 2.34 million in the three months to December 2013, down 125,000 from the previous three months and down 161,000 from the same period a year ago. The unemployment rate was 7.2%, down 0.4 from the previous three months and down 0.6 from a year earlier.

The unemployment rate for 16-24 year olds was 19.9% in the three months to December 2013, down 1.0 percentage point from the previous three Excluding people in months. full-time education, there were 637,000 unemployed 16-24 year olds in the three months to December 2013, down 27,000 from the previous three months. The corresponding unemployment rate was 18.2% of the economically active population for 16-24 year olds not in FTE, down 0.9 percentage points from the previous three months.




The seasonally adjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom decreased by 27,600 last month to 1,215,700 and was down 327,600 over the year.

The number of people in employment aged 16 and over increased by 193,000 over the quarter to reach 30.15 million. The employment rate for those aged 16 to 64 is now 72.1%, up 0.3 from the previous quarter and up 0.6 from a year earlier.

The number of people in full-time employment increased by 209,000 on the quarter to reach 22.07 million. The number of people in part-time employment was 8.07 million in the three months to December 2013, down 16,000 on the previous quarter.

In the three months to December 2013, there were 8.93 million economically inactive people aged from 16 to 64, up 8,000 from the previous quarter but down 23,000 from a year earlier.

Average total pay (including bonuses) was £478



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
per week in December 2013. Over the year total pay for employees in Great Britain rose by 1.1%. Average regular pay (excluding bonuses) was £450 per week in December 2013. Over the year regular pay for employees in Great Britain by 1.0%. Between rose December 2012 and December 2013, the Consumer Prices Index increased by 2.0%. Prices therefore have increased at a faster rate than earnings over the last year.

There were 580,000 job vacancies in the three months to January 2014, up 28,000 from the three months to October 2013 and up 89,000 on a year earlier.

There were 4.1 unemployed people per vacancy in the period from October to December 2013, down 0.4 on the quarter and down by 1.0 on the year.

In the three months to 2013, December 111,000 people became redundant in the three months prior to their Labour Force Survey interview. This is down 13,000 from the previous three months and down 34,000 on the year. The redundancy rate was 4.4 per 1,000 employees, down 0.5 from the previous three months and down 1.4 from a year earlier.

The unadjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom



has increased by 41,400 over the month to 1,242,912. The proportion unemployed calculated on the residence base now stands at 3.0% of the population aged 16-64.

The number of claimants in Nottinghamshire increased by 993 between December 2013 and January 2014. The total of 24,693 is 5,897 less than it was a year ago (see figure 1).

The proportion unemployed in Nottinghamshire is now 3.5%. This is higher than the East Midlands (2.8%) and the United Kingdom (3.0%).

Between December 2013 and January 2014, unemployment increased in all of the four Travel To Work Areas the County (figure in 2). Mansfield experienced the largest increase, with a rate of change of 7.4%, followed by Nottingham with 3.8%. Worksop & Retford with 3.7% and Lincoln with 3.6%.

Compared with January 2013, all of the four TTWA's in County have the reduced numbers of claimants. The largest change has been in Nottingham with a rate of change of -21.3% followed by Mansfield with -19.9%, Lincoln with -17.9% and Worksop & Retford with -13.3%. Unemployment increased in all of the seven Local Authority Districts in the County between December 2013 and 2014. The Januarv laraest increases were in Ashfield with a rate of chanae of 6.6%. Broxtowe with 5.8% and Newark & Sherwood also with 5.8%.

Unemployment in the City of Nottingham increased by 343 over the month resulting in a rate of change of 3.0%.

The rates of change have varied throughout the County over the year, from -27.8% in

The rates shown in tables 1-4 are supplied by ONS. They are calculated by expressing the claimant count figures as a proportion of the resident population aged 16-64 derived from the latest mid-year population figures.

Broxtowe to -13.7% in Bassetlaw. Nottingham City changed by -16.6% over the year.

Un employment increased in all of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County during January. Ashfield recorded the largest increase, experiencing a rate of change of 8.6% followed by Newark with 5.8% and Sherwood also with 5.8%. Over the month Nottingham East has changed by 3.3%, Nottingham North by 1.8% and Nottingham South by 4.4%.

All of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County have decreased numbers of claimants compared with the same period last year resulting in rates of change ranging from -10.6% in Bassetlaw to -28.1% in Broxtowe. The three Nottingham Constituencies have rates of change of -15.1% in Nottingham East, -17.9% in Nottingham North and -17.1% in Nottingham South.



### New Disclosure Control Procedures with JSA Claimant Count Data

A new disclosure control procedure has been introduced with JSA claimant count data on NOMIS with effect from 15th November. The procedure follows an interim review of the confidentiality of JSA claimant count data, and is required for compliance with the National Statistics Code of Practice for Data Access and Confidentiality. This is an interim measure pending a thorough assessment of the risk to the confidentiality of claimant count data early next year.


The procedure is the primary suppression of any cell count of 1 or 2, which is instead denoted by the symbol '#'. A true value of zero continues to be shown as 0.
