ADMISSION ARRANGEMENTS 2015/2016

The Kimberley School is a specialist school in Technology and an 11-18 mixed comprehensive school. The Kimberley School has strong links within the Kimberley Family of Schools with whom we collaborate at all levels. Our admissions policy reflects commitment to this collaboration. The schools referred to in this document as the Kimberley Family of Schools are Awsworth Primary, Gilthill Primary, Hollywell Primary, Horsendale Primary, Kimberley Primary, Larkfields Junior and Mornington Primary.

Pupils will be admitted at the age of 11+ without reference to ability or aptitude. The proposed published admission number for Year 7 in September 2015 is 240.

As required by the regulations of 2005, children for whom The Kimberley School is the named school in a statement of special educational need will be automatically offered a place at the school. The Governing Body of the school cannot guarantee a place at the school for any other category of application.

Admission oversubscription criteria

If the school is oversubscribed, the criteria listed below will be used to determine the allocation of places. In the event of over oversubscription within any criteria, places will be allocated on proximity to the school measured by the Nottinghamshire County Council 's computerised distance measuring software (NCCCDMS). The criteria is:

1. Children who are 'looked after' at the time an application for admission is made and who the local authority confirm will still be 'looked after' at the time of admission to school as also required by the regulations of 2005.

Note: Throughout this document a 'looked after child' or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence or special guardianship order is defined as set out in the Appendix hereto.

- 2. Children who attend the Kimberley Family of Schools who were on the roll at the time of application and who were still on roll on the closing date for applications. Within this category first priority will be given to those <u>who</u> will have a brother or sister attending The Kimberley School at the time of application.
- 3. Children not attending the Kimberley Family of Schools <u>who will have a brother or sister attending The</u> Kimberley School at the time of application.

All Other children

In the event of oversubscription within any criteria, places will be allocated on proximity to the school measured by the Nottinghamshire County Council 's computerised distance measuring software (NCCCDMS). In the event that there are applicants whose proximity to the school (as measured by the NCCCDMS) is equal, place(s) will be allocated by lot the process and drawing of which shall be verified by a person independent of the school.

NOTE: Parents shall not be admitted to the drawing of lots because to do so would effectively advise them of the outcome of their application before offer day: this would be a breach of the coordinated admission arrangements.

NB:

Applicants who can establish exceptional medical or special educational needs (i.e. a learning or behavioural difficulty which calls for special educational provision) relating to the child. Supporting written evidence from a doctor and/or other relevant professional agencies must be provided at the time of application. This should be accompanied by full supporting evidence setting out the particular reasons why it is considered that The Kimberley School is the most suitable school and outlining the difficulties that would be caused if the child had to attend another school. The Governing Body will seek to assess the evidence presented objectively and may seek any independent specialist advice deemed necessary.

Sixth Form Admission oversubscription criteria

Published admission number for external students- 20

Admissions into the Sixth Form will be allocated to those who have applied having regard to the following factors set out in order of priority, after those children with a statement of special educational needs that names the school have been admitted:

- 1. Children who are looked after and previously looked after children
- Pupils transferring from within The Kimberley School who meet the school's minimum entry requirements*.
 Such students are guaranteed a place irrespective of numbers.
 - *5 A-C's for AS Levels (or who meet the criteria for specific subjects).
- 3. Pupils transferring from other schools who meet the school's minimum entry requirements [up to a total maximum number of students in Year 12 and Year 13 of 300]. (At least 20 places will be available for pupils transferring from other schools.)
- 4. Courses are offered subject to viability at the time of curriculum planning.

In the event of there being more applicants than places available in 2 above, the deciding factors will be, in order of priority:

- (i) Whether there is a brother or sister on The Kimberley School roll at the time of application to the Sixth Form;
- (ii) Pupils who live nearest to the school (distances measured from the entrance to the pupil's home to the principal entrance of the main administrative building of the school using mileage as provided through AA route finder as measured by post code to post code).

Waiting List

In the event of over subscription, the school will operate a waiting list. A child's place on the waiting list will be determined by the above criteria. That place may go up or down depending on whether places become available or if late or mid-term applications are received. The Governors of the school in partnership with the Nottinghamshire County Council will administer the waiting list for the duration of the co-ordinated admissions scheme. Once the co-

ordinated scheme is closed, the waiting list will remain open until 31 December annually and will be administered by the Governors of the School. After 31 December applications will be regarded as lapsed and shall be disregarded. (A new application may be submitted).

Applications

All applications for places in the normal year of entry are made on the common application form. For entrance to the school in September, the closing date of the co-ordinated admission scheme is 31st October preceding admission to secondary school. Outcomes are issued to parents on 1st March. A copy of the co-ordinated admission scheme is available from Nottinghamshire County council. No additional form is required.

Late Applications

Late applications are those submitted after the closing date for the co-ordinated admissions scheme and will be dealt with in accordance with that scheme. Late applications will be considered up to the date in late December specified in the co-ordinated scheme, providing the applicant can evidence that there were exceptional reasons for missing the closing date, for example family bereavement, hospitalisation or family trauma.

In-year applications

The school considers all in-year applications for parents/carers that apply to the school. The school will communicate the decision of the governing body to the parent/carer and notify the local authority of the decision. Parents will be required to confirm their acceptance of a place to the School within 14 days. All applications received in-year will be dealt with in accordance with the above criteria.

In the event of a place being available in the appropriate year group then that will be offered by Governors but communicated to parents by the school. If no places are available, the child's name will be added to the waiting list and will be subject of movement up or down the waiting list as described above; parents will be offered the right of appeal. Parents should lodge an appeal within 20 school days of receiving the outcome of their application.

Where mid-term applicants are received from children for whom The Kimberley School is the named school in a statement of special educational needs or from children 'looked after' by the Local Authority, the school will admit regardless of whether or not a place is available in that year group.

Withdrawing an Offer of a Place

Any offers of a place found to be made fraudulently can be withdrawn. Under the co-ordinated scheme, parents should confirm their acceptance of the place offered within 14 days.

Appeals

Parents have the right to an independent appeals panel if they are not happy with the outcome of their application. Any appeal should be made to the Clerk to the Admissions Appeal Panel, The Kimberley School, within 20 school days from the date of the refusal letter. Parents will receive notice of the date of appeal at least 10 days in advance of the hearing. Repeat applications in the same academic year will not be considered unless there is a significant and material change in circumstances.

Fair Access Protocol

The school recognises its responsibility to fulfil its statutory duties under the admissions code and will participate in the local area protocol.

APPENDIX:

Notes and Definition of Terms

Residence

This is defined as the child's ordinary place of residence, which is deemed to be the residential property at which the child normally and habitually resides with the person or persons having parental responsibility for the child at the time of completion of the application form. If a child's parents live at separate addresses, which ever of the two addresses the child spends at least 3 school nights i.e. Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday will be taken as the place of residence. Addresses of other relatives or friends will not be considered as the place of residence even when the child stays there for all or part of the week. Proof of residence and other evidence from the court regarding parental responsibilities in these matters may be required.

Brother and Sister

The Governors define brother and sister as being those children who share at least one biological parent. This includes half- brother or half-sister or legally adopted child living at the same address as the child.

Parent

Section 576 of the Education Act 1996 defines 'parent' to include: all natural parents, whether they are married or not: and any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child or a young person.

Having parental responsibility means assuming all the rights, duties, powers, responsibilities and authority that a parent of a child has by law. People other than a child's natural parent can acquire parental responsibility.

UK Service Personnel and Other Crown Servants

Applications from families of UK Service Personnel and other Crown Servants will be processed in line with the Governors admissions criteria. The Governors will accept an official MOD, FOC or GCHQ letter declaring a relocation date as proof of residence within the catchment area of the Family of Schools and the child or children will be offered a place if places are available or placed on the waiting list and be subject to move up and down the list as described above.

Looked after children and previously looked after children

The school will use the definition of 'looked after child' from The Education (Admission of Looked After Children) (England) Regulations 2006 i.e :

A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989)

An adoption order is an order under section 46 of the Adoption and Children Act 2002. A 'residence order' is an order settling the arrangements to be made as to the person with whom the child is to live under section 8 of the Children Act 1989. Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians)
