Writing the Lifeless Body

Between 1828 and 1866, Nottinghamshire coroner Christopher Swann



conducted around 4,500 inquests in public houses in the county, from the mundane (drownings) to the bizarre (death by oxtail soup). This writing workshop uses documents held at Nottinghamshire Archives to inspire stories about sudden death in the nineteenth century. You could write about the events leading up to tragedies, the effects on friends, relations and onlookers, or the hullaballoo of the inquest itself. A series of simple writing exercises will help you use Nottinghamshire's gory history to generate ideas for and then write (serious or comic) stories.

The Diaries of a Georgian Lady

Gertrude Savile (1697 - 1758) was a Georgian lady who never married. She was the sister of Sir George Savile, seventh baronet and MP, whose principal residence was at Rufford Abbey. Through a series of intimate diaries she records the details of her life in London and Nottinghamshire, referring to the South Sea Bubble, the Beggar's Opera, the difficulty of retaining good servants and the increasingly fraught relationship with her mother. Join us as we explore the life of this fascinating Georgian lady.

From Poor Relief to Parish **Officer: the Lives of Ordinary Women in the Archives**
