The purpose of carrying out an Equality Impact Assessment is to assess the impact of a change to services or policy on people with protected characteristics and to demonstrate that the Council has considered the aims of the Equality Duty.

Part A: Impact, consultation and proposed mitigation

1 What are the potential impacts of proposal? Has any initial consultation informed the identification of impacts?

The proposal focuses on the reduction of duplication of service delivery of Open Access Youth Work. This will be achieved through the reduction of two Open Access Young People's Centres (YPC) at Sutton in Ashfield and Worksop from 31/3/18. Reducing Sutton in Ashfield and Worksop to one YPC each in line with other communities in the county.

The rationale for the proposal is to make the necessary budget reduction within the Youth Service with minimum reduction to the quantity and quality of Early Help and Positive Activities available to young people and therefore still meet the statutory obligation of a sufficient offer of activities as set out in the Government's Statutory Guidance for Local Authorities on Services and Activities to Improve Young People's Well-being.

The Youth Service is an open access service whose provision is available to all 10-19 year olds (or until their 25th birthday if they have a disability and are already engaged with service delivery).

A voluntary disabled group currently has free use of Quarrydale YPC on one evening per week.
