In the event of over-subscription places will be offered to applicants in the following order of preference:

*A copy of Baptismal certificates must be submitted with applications to ensure correct categorisation.

Where a distinction has to be made within one of the above categories, preference will be given to siblings, then, as a tie break, distance from the student's home address (as defined by the Local Authority) to the Main Entrance of All Saints School "as the crow flies" will be used, preference being given to the shortest distance. In the event of two distances being equal, lots will be drawn and independently verified.

Over-subscription criteria for the Post-16 centre

Where the number of applications for admission exceeds the number of places available, the following criteria will be applied in the order set out below, to decide which children to admit:

In the event of an over subscription in either criterion, proximity to the school will be used with those living nearer being given priority. Distance measurements to be made 'as the crow flies from home address to the reception office of main school building using Google Earth.

Where applications are received in respect of twins, triplets or children of other multiple births, Arnold Hill Academy will endeavour in all of these cases to offer places at the Academy admitting above the planned admission number where necessary. The parent/carer will still have a right of appeal against a refusal of a place.
