Overview of the "Tackling Emerging Threats to Children" Project

- 1. The aim of this project is to develop a **coordinated**, **partnership response** to tackling a wide range of underlying vulnerabilities and emerging threats to children, by **building on activity that is already happening** and **undertaking a commissioning exercise**, in order to pull this activity together and provide a package of support to schools, children and their families.
- 2. This Project will focus on the threats children face from **Child Sexual Exploitation**, **Radicalisation / Extremism**, **online grooming**, **Female Genital Mutilation**, **cyber-bullying** and **associated internet safety concerns**
- 3. Nottinghamshire Schools Forum has approved funding of £1.2 million over 3 years to develop Universal, Targeted and Specialist Support Offers. These will work in synergy with a Recovery Support Offer and the commissioning of the Schools Health Hub
- 4. Activity is now underway with partners including schools, the police and health colleagues to develop and implement these support offers. This is due to be completed by 1st April 2016.
