A Monthly Analysis of Employment, Unemployment and Jobs

November 2015

Unemployment according to the Government's preferred measure was 1.71 million in the three months to October 2015, down 110,000 from the previous three months and down 244,000 from the same period a year ago. The unemployment rate was 5.2%, down 0.3% from the previous three months and down 0.8% from a year earlier.

The unemployment rate for 18-24 year olds was 12.3% in the three months to October 2015, down by 1.7% on the guarter and down 2.4% on the There were 503,000 year. unemployed young people aged from 18 to 24 in the guarter to October 2015. This is down by 75,000 on the quarter and down by 97,000 over the year. Comparisons of youth unemployment over time are complicated by the fact that unemployment rates are calculated as the number of unemployed people divided by the economically active Key Facts Claimant count in Nottinghamshire falls by 716 over the month. Jobless total now 13,737.



population which excludes those not seeking or available for work. Unemployment rates are not the proportion of the total population who are unemployed. They are the proportion of the economically active population (those in work plus those seeking and available to work) who are unemployed. The long-term increase in the proportion of young people going into fulltime education reduces the size of the economically active population and therefore increases the unemployment rate.

The seasonally adjusted claimant figure for the United Kingdom decreased by 12,000 last month to 683,600 and was down 209,096 over the year.

The number of people in employment aged 16 and over increased by 207,000 over the quarter to reach 31.30 million. The employment rate for those aged 16 to 64 is now 73.9%, the highest since comparable records began in 1971.

The number of people in full-time employment increased

The number of people in part-time employment was 8.42 million in the three months to October 2015, up 64,000 on the previous quarter.


In the three months to October 2015, there were 8.93 million economically inactive people aged from 16 to 64, down 63,000 from the previous quarter and down 126,000 from a year earlier.

Average total pay (including bonuses) was £493 per week in October 2015. Over the year total pay for employees in Great Britain increased by 2.4%. A v e r a g e regular pay (excluding bonuses) was £463 per week in October 2015. Over the year regular pay for employees in Great Britain rose by 2.0%. Between October 2014 and October 2015, there was a 0.1% increase in the Consumer Prices Index.

There were 747,000 job vacancies in the three months to November 2015, 2,000 more than in the previous three months and 45,000 more than a year earlier.

There were 2.3 unemployed people per vacancy in the period from August to October 2015, down 0.2 on the quarter and down by 0.5 on the year.

In the three months to October 2015, 105,000 people



became redundant in the three months prior to their Labour Force Survey interview. This is down 2,000 from the previous three months but up 3,000 on the year. The redundancy rate was 4.0 per 1,000 employees, down -0.1% from the previous three months but unchanged from a year earlier.

The unadjusted JSA claimant figure for the United Kingdom has decreased by 22,141 over the month to 641,989. The proportion unemployed calculated on the residence base now stands at 1.6% of the population aged 16-64.

The number of claimants in Nottinghamshire decreased by 716 between October and November 2015. The total of 13,737 is 3,790 less than it was a year ago (see figure 1).

The proportion unemployed in Nottinghamshire is now 1.9%. This is higher than the East Midlands (1.4%) and the United Kingdom (1.6%).

Between October and November 2015, unemployment decreased in all of the four Travel To Work Areas in the County (figure 2). Mansfield experienced the largest decrease with a rate of change of -10.2%, followed by Worksop & Retford with -5.9%, Nottingham with -3.8% and Lincoln with -0.9%.

Compared with November 2014, all of the four TTWA's in the County have reduced numbers of claimants. The largest change has been in Worksop & Retford with a rate of change of -32.9% followed by Mansfield with -23.7%, Nottingham with -20.3% and Lincoln with -13.4%.

Unemployment decreased in all of the seven Local Authority Districts in the County over the month. The largest decreases

were in Newark & Sherwood with -11.9%, Ashfield with -8.8% and Mansfield with -8.4%. Unemployment in the City of Nottingham decreased by 208 over the month resulting in a rate of change of -2.9%.

The rates of change have varied throughout the County over the year, from -32.5% in Bassetlaw to -10.9% in Broxtowe. Nottingham City changed by -19.9% over the year.

Unemployment decreased in all of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County during November. Ashfield, Newark, Mansfield and Sherwood recorded the largest decreases, experiencing rates of change of -10.2%, -8.7%, -8.4% and -8.4% respectively. Over the month Nottingham East has changed by -3.5%, Nottingham North by -2.9% and Nottingham South by -2.0%. All of the eight Parliamentary Constituencies in the County have decreased numbers of claimants compared with the same period last year resulting in rates of change ranging from -11.4% in Broxtowe to -33.4% in Bassetlaw. The three Nottingham Constituencies have rates of change of -22.4% in Nottingham East, -19.0% in Nottingham North and -16.9% in Nottingham South.


