UPDATE ON THE OUTCOME OF THE INTEGRATED COMMUNITY CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S HEALTHCARE (ICCYPH) PROGRAMME PROCUREMENT

Purpose of the Report

1. To inform the Children's Trust Executive about the outcomes of the Integrated Community Children and Young People's Healthcare (ICCYPH) Programme.

- II. That Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust are the successful bidder for the ICCYPH service.
- III. The initiation of phase 3, including mobilisation and transformation.

Information and Advice

Background:

- 2. The ICCYPH is a Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) funded service that covers the CCG areas of Mansfield & Ashfield, Newark & Sherwood, Rushcliffe, Nottingham North and East, Nottingham West and Nottingham City. The Children's Integrated Commissioning Hub within Nottinghamshire County Council is commissioning this service on behalf of these CCGs.
- 3. The ICCYPH service will deliver specialist children and young people's community nursing, occupational therapy, speech & language therapy, physiotherapy and phlebotomy.
- 4. The vision for this service is to enable children and young people with acute and additional health needs, including disability and complex needs, to have their health needs met wherever they are. The services will support the child's life choices rather than restrict them and improve the quality of life for children and their families and carers.

- 5. The transformation of these services has been ongoing since 2012 and has been broken down into three distinct phases.
- 6. Phase one started in 2012 and was competed in September 2013, this phase involved:
 - Scoping and mapping to identify local and national practice, current service provision and developments, models and approaches.
 - Co-production with young people, families, providers and stakeholders.
 - Population and service data collection and analysis.
 - Phase one report which outlined a 'Families Statement of Expectations'.
 The key recommendations were to move from a fragmented service with multiple assessments to one integrated service with integrated assessment/s. - 7. Phase two started in September 2014 and was completed with the award of the tender in October 2015, this phase involved:
 - The procurement of the new service. The ICCYPH was procured as part of the South CCGs Community Services Tender which ran from March until September 2015.
 - A service specification and outcomes framework were co-produced through discussions with children, young people and families, clinicians and the market.
 - Representatives of Nottinghamshire County Council's Education and Social Care teams were involved in evaluating the tender. As were children, young people and family representatives from the Nottinghamshire Participation Hub, South Nottinghamshire Transformation Programme and Nottinghamshire Young Pioneers.
 - The outcome of the tender was that Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust are the new provider of the ICCYPH Programme.
- 8. Phase three started in November 2015 and will be ongoing through the life of this contract, this phase will include:
 - The mobilisation and transformation of the new service. This began formally on the 25th November 2015. The new contract for this service came in to effect on the 1st April 2016 with a contract length for 5 years (with a potential extension of 2 years available).
 - The ambitious phased transformation of the service over the early life of the contract.
 - Continual improvement and integration across other statutory, third sector and private services.
 - Continued collaborative working and co-production with children, young people and families, local authorities – education and social care commissioners, special schools, and clinicians.

 Alignment with the Nottinghamshire County Council – Improving Outcomes for Disabled Children and Young People Transformation Programme.
