Table 1 the number of children requiring statutory child protection interventions (per 10,000)






Table 2 the percentage of children becoming the subject of a child protection plan on more than one occasion






Table 4 the percentage of core assessments for Children's Social Care carried out within timescales




Table 7 achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 4




Table 8 achievement of 5+ A-C grades or equivalent, including English and Mathematics




Table 9 the percentage of young people who have attained a full Level 3 qualification by age 19






Table 10 the percentage of young people in Years 12-14 not in education, employment or training (NEET)


