

Reading Recovery

The English service is working with the Education Endowment Fund to research and design the most effective interventions. All their work is based on the most-up to date best practice.

Reading Recovery is a teacher-led reading and writing early intervention, accredited by the UCL Institute of Education providing pupils with daily, 30 minute personalised, 1:1 lessons for between 12 and 20 weeks. The programme accelerates the learning of the most vulnerable and lowest attaining pupils in Key Stage One. It develops active, independent problem solving and provides children with immediate feedback

Reading Recovery has unrivalled research evidence of enabling children to catch up with their peers quickly, and maintain their gains until at least the end of KS2. The European Literacy Policy Network recognises it as an example of good practice in literacy education.

Initial Professional Development

The professional development course includes

- training on the diagnostic assessment of literacy
- 18 half-day training sessions with observation of live lessons
- half-termly visits to school to provide 1:1 support
- access to a secure national database for tracking and reporting outcomes

The year long Reading Recovery initial professional development costs £2,750 and begins 7.9.17

Continuing Professional Development

The professional development course includes

- six half-termly ½ day professional learning sessions alongside other Reading Recovery teacher colleagues
- support for data analysis and review
- advice for an ECaR plan of action for whole-school impact
- opportunities to observe, analyse and discuss live Reading Recovery lessons
- a minimum of one Teacher Leader school visit to observe teaching and discuss individual pupil progress, ensuring fidelity to the programme
- unlimited bespoke support via email and telephone
- reduced cost of the Annual ECaR Conference
- training in Switch-on and Guided Reading
- training to allow implementation of group support through Inference Training
- access to a range of resources on the Switch-on website www.switch-onliteracy.co.uk
- payment of the annual Registration to IOE ULC of £90 with opportunities to achieve national recognition through Annual Reading Recovery Awards

Switch-on (2 Day Course)

Switch-on is a 20 minute, trained-adult led, personalised reading and writing intervention for children and young people who are vulnerable or underachieving across the primary and secondary age range.

Switch-on has been evaluated by the Education Endowment Foundation and has been shown to have a positive impact. See www.educationendowmentfoundation.org.uk/projects/switch-on-reading/ for details.

Aims:

- The aim of the intervention is for children and young people to be able to participate more fully in the classroom by becoming more confident and active, independent readers and writer, who will then be able to use a range of effective reading and writing strategies in order to achieve their full literacy potential.
- To train staff to support children effectively by implementing the 1/1 reading and writing intervention – Switch-on.
