Closing the Gap

Introduction

Closing educational gaps is an on-going national and local priority. The Closing the Gap (CtG) Team at Nottinghamshire County Council support schools to investigate and implement the most effective methods for using their Pupil Premium (PP) funding to close education gaps and to make sure that all children, especially those who are disadvantaged or vulnerable, are given the best education.

All training by the CtG Team directly responds to the moral imperative of ensuring that vulnerable children and young people achieve educational success by making accelerated progress which will maximise their life chances and secure their future economic well-being. We are determined to ensure that all children and young people really do have the opportunity to fulfil their potential whatever their background. We shall work in partnership across Councils and with other partners including schools and, of course, with children, young people and their families.

Our vision is for the East Midlands to be a place where children increasingly grow up free from deprivation and disadvantage and where birth and social background do not hold people back from achieving their potential.

Pupil Premium

The CtG Team has worked with Nottinghamshire Schools for the past decade, collecting examples of best practice and generating exemplar materials, data collection methodologies and key questions and activities to support school self-review in terms of closing gaps. Through this, Education Improvement Advisers have now developed a Senior Leaders' Pupil Premium Self Evaluation PP Toolkit, the research of which drives the consultancy and support given to schools. It is also used to lead NCC's PP Reviews, to quality assure practice and to generate key recommendations for improvement.

Consultancy from the CtG Team is bespoke to the specific needs of the schools, but is widely covered by:

- 1) Pupil Premium Reviews:**
A two day review of current practice in the school, and a third day which will produce a report covering strengths and areas for improvement in terms of the school's closing the gaps practices and strategies.
- 2) Governor training to monitor and evaluate the impact of Pupil Premium funding**
- 3) Coaching for evaluating the quality of learning and curriculum experiences for disadvantaged pupils (including a 'Pupil Pursuit' approach)**
