Thank you for your recent Freedom of Information Request in relation to information about residents in older peoples nursing or care homes; I have laid out our responses to your questions below:

Where a * is found, please refer to the below explanatory note:

**Explanatory Note: Nottinghamshire County Council only holds records of those residents where the Council pay towards the cost of their care. We do not hold comprehensive records of all adults in all care/nursing homes within the County, and as such, we would not be able to tell how many people live in every care home in Nottinghamshire, or indeed their ages, neurological conditions or general health status. In addition, if we did hold any data, we would not hold any of this data in a reportable format.*

a) How many residents between the age of 18 and 64 in your local authority area currently live in an older people's nursing or care home (i.e. a residential facility where the majority of residents are aged 65 or over)?

Response to 1a): As at end of July 2017 there were 30 Young Adults* funded in Long Term residential or nursing homes, where the CQC 'age specialism' is given as 'caring for adults over 65 years'.
