The Public Sector Equality Duty which is set out in the Equality Act 2010 requires public authorities to have due regard to the need to: Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation; Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not; Foster good relations between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not.

The purpose of carrying out an Equality Impact Assessment is to assess the impact of a change to services or policy on people with protected characteristics and to demonstrate that the Council has considered the aims of the Equality Duty.

### Part A: Impact, consultation and proposed mitigation

#### 1 What are the potential impacts of proposal? Has any initial consultation informed the identification of impacts?

This proposal would reduce the number of offices available for registration appointments from 16 to 11. Members of the public who would have used local offices in Bingham, East Leake, Ollerton, Southwell and Stapleford would have to travel to other offices to access registration services.

The current Bingham and East Leake offices are both less than 10 miles distant from the West Bridgford office. The Ollerton Office is less than 11 miles from three other offices (Worksop, Retford and Mansfield). The Southwell office is 8 miles from the Newark office, and the Stapleford office is less than 4 miles from the Beeston office.

Travel to alternative offices may be more difficult for customers with a disability, older adults, and couples with young children.
