



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN in accordance with the provisions of Section 19 (1) of the Education and Inspections Act (EIA) 2006 that Nottinghamshire County Council proposes to make a prescribed alteration to Mattersey Community Primary School located at Thorpe Road, Mattersey, Nottinghamshire, DN10 5ED, by providing in its existing premises Early Years Places for 10 full-time equivalent boys and girls between the ages of 3-5 years with effect from 8 September 2014. Consequently this will change the age range of the school from 5-11 years to 3-11 years.

It is intended within the 2014/2015 school year when the proposal is to be implemented that the number of pupils to be admitted into the first age group of the main school will remain at 10, subject to annual consultation on admissions arrangements.

The effect of this proposal will not alter the school's current net capacity and so this will remain as 70 pupil places, subject to annual consultation on admissions arrangements.

Please refer to the Explanatory Note below concerning the admission arrangements for the proposed early years places.

Explanatory Note :

1. The term 10 full-time equivalent (or 20 part-time) refers to the total number of 3 and 4 year old pupils, both full-time and part-time, who will be admitted to the early years places. Children will be entitled to an early years place in accordance with the County Council's nursery admissions policy. The County Council's Strategic Place Planning and School Admissions service has considered the most appropriate pattern of pre-school provision that should be made available in the above school's locality.
2. The admission number of 10 refers to pupils who will enter the main school at age around 4 years whether having previously attended the early years places or not. Admission from the early years places to the main school is not guaranteed and would be subject to the school's admission arrangements for full-time education.
