2. The procedure for getting care/supported living referrals? These can be in the form of a framework, spot contract and/or advertisement (pro contract, chest, etc.)

Supported Living

NCC currently has a core provider model in place for Care, Support and Enablement packages. Within the Care Support and Enablement contract there are 4 core providers. The core contract requires providers to pick up all current supported living packages for Adults aged 18-64 at the time of referral. There are occasional exceptions to this. An example could be where a service user cannot work with the core provider due to a previous history for example. To enable those packages to be procured there is a Multi-Provider Agreement (more commonly referred to as a Framework).

The Multi-Provider Agreement allows for the Council to call off support packages under Lot 1 (as described above) as well as a Lot 2 where the Council may seek to source a provider who can bring a housing solution along with the delivery of care and support. The Multi-Provider Agreement is listed on pro-contract under East Midlands tenders.

Residential and nursing care

From August 2016 Nottinghamshire County Council changed the way it commissions Younger Adults (18-64) Residential Care Placements. Individual placement specifications are published via a Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS), allowing providers to submit a bid detailing how they intend to meet the needs outlined, and the proposed weekly costs.

The DPS enables the Authority to procure appropriate residential care services offering residential care or nursing services which promote independence and help people move into supported accommodation. The majority of work procured through the DPS will be placements for individuals. On occasions however the DPS may be used for other arrangements, for example to purchase a block of beds for emergency or respite use.

Providers must have experience of providing residential care services relevant to this DPS, be registered with the care regulator and must comply with the relevant regulatory standards. The provider list will operate electronically via the Due North procurement portal. The DPS will operate for a period of 10 years.
