Some children and young people with Autistic Spectrum Disorders may qualify for these benefits. You can get an application form for DLA (for a child under 16 years of age) by ringing 03457 123456.

For PIP (16 years and over) phone 0800 917 2222 (textphone 0800 917 7777) to start your claim. Parents can ring on the young person's behalf, but the young person needs to be with them when they call. Details needed include their National Insurance number, bank details and doctor's name. They will then be sent a form to complete.

It is worth getting help with completing the forms. There may be a local welfare rights advice session, where you can get help. The Children's Development Centre also currently has sessions on Mondays where you can get help with the form. Phone 0115 8831157 or 58 for an appointment.

# Schools and Families Specialist Services

#### Who are we?

We are specialist teachers and teaching assistants with additional qualifications and experience in working with children and young people with a range of special educational needs aged from 0 -19.

The Service comprises four specialist teams:

- Early Years
- Autism (Communication and Interaction Team)
- Cognition and Learning
- Sensory

#### What do we do?

We work in homes, early years settings and schools offering advice, information and support to children and young people with complex special educational needs and to their families and the staff who work with them.

# The Early Years Team

The Early Years Team works with children with a range of complex special educational needs and disabilities from birth to the end of Key Stage 1 (approximately 7 years of age). The team comprises specialists for children with complex learning needs, communication and interaction needs/autism and for hearing impaired and visually impaired children.

#### What do we provide?

- regular home teaching for children before they attend school
- support and advice to parents and carers
- transition planning
- advice and training to staff in schools and early years settings

We accept referrals from parents/carers, from schools and from other professionals. Most referrals for children attending maintained nurseries and schools are made at termly Family Springboard meetings.

# The Autism Team (or Communication and Interaction Team)

This team works with children and young people in Key Stages 2-5 (approximately 8 -19 years of age) with severe and complex communication and interaction needs/autism spectrum disorder. We work in mainstream and special schools and support children in situations particularly where the placement is at risk.

#### What do we provide?

- training for school staff in autism
- support to develop and implement appropriate interventions
- support with developing appropriate curriculum to address children's needs
- support to measure and monitor progress and the impact of Interventions

Most requests for our support are made termly at Family Springboard meetings.

# The Cognition and Learning Team

The Cognition and Learning Team, work primarily in mainstream schools with children and young people in Key Stages 2-5 (approximately 8-19 years of age) with complex learning difficulties.

#### What do we provide?

- advice and training for school staff in a range of learning needs, e.g. Down Syndrome, rare cognitive disorders, dyslexia
- support in developing and using appropriate interventions and resources, including ICT
- support with individualising the curriculum to address children's needs
- support with measuring and monitoring progress

Most requests for our support are made at termly Family Springboard meetings.

# The Sensory Team

This team consists of specialist teachers and teaching assistants of the deaf and visually impaired, a rehabilitation officer and a resource technician. The team works with children and young people in Key Stages 2-5 (approximately 8-19 years of age) with sensory impairments.

#### What do we provide?

- specialist assessments and interventions
- · advice and support to parents and carers
- information, advice and training to school staff in meeting the educational needs of the children and young people, and in using specialist resources and approaches
- support and training in independent living skills

We accept referrals from parents, health professionals and schools. Most requests for support from schools are made at termly Family Springboard meetings.

# Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Children and Young People's Disability Registration Form



The Children's Disability Register is a database of children and young people with disabilities up to the age of 25 who live in Nottingham or Nottinghamshire, or who have their home base here. It is managed and maintained by Family Action on behalf of Nottingham City Council and Nottinghamshire County Council. Registration is entirely voluntary.

Please remember, you can ask for a copy of the information that is held about your child(ren) and/or ask for them to be removed at any time.

Things to bear in mind:

- To be on the register a child or young person must have a permanent and substantial disability as a result of either a disability, a permanent health condition or a long-term illness or be seeking a diagnosis.
- The child or young person must be under 25 and live in Nottingham or Nottinghamshire.
- Anyone with parental responsibility can complete this form for a child or young person aged 16 or under.
- Young people who are over 16 can complete their own form.
- There are four sections to the form. The more information you provide the better but if there are questions that don't apply to you or your child then just leave them blank.
- If you need advice or assistance in filling in the form please call IRIS on 0115 8533291.
- If you have two or more children with a disability then you will need to complete a registration form for each child.
