




ORANGE WINDSOCK

Beware of winds blowing out to sea










Red flag

Danger, stay out of the water











Red and yellow flag

Pupils should understand that dangers are still present and that they should always be careful in and around the water











Black & white chequered flag

Between these flags is for nonswimming water sports such as surfing and wind surfing









Windsock or orange flag

This shows the direction and force of the wind, special care should be taken during an offshore wind (blowing out to sea).

Inflatables should only be used if tethered with an onshore wind.
