

NCC-044129-20 - Archaeological Alert Zones

Dear Requester,

Please see below the departments response to your Freedom of information request.

The NCC archaeological constraint mapping identifies the historic core of every village in the County as an area of archaeological potential, where buried archaeological remains associated with Medieval occupation of the area may be expected. Bradmore and Normanton on the Wolds both have defined historic village cores.

Information on our HER data is here <https://www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/culture-leisure/heritage/historic-environment-record>. The web site makes it very clear that not all our data is held on the Heritage Gateway, and that people need to come to us direct for the full record. As our web-site states; "Simple searches of the Nottinghamshire HER can be done online through The Heritage Gateway .

Please note that local HER records contain much more detailed information than is available through the Heritage Gateway. The full HER records should be consulted for all commercial and planning related matters

We trust this now resolves your enquiry and where we have not been able to provide details we expect that this information is not held by Nottinghamshire county Council at this time.

We suggest all requesters search under our publication scheme in advance of requesting information under the freedom of information act.

Please could you confirm the location of any Archaeological Alert Zones that have been identified

within the boundaries of Rushcliffe Borough Council.

The Nottinghamshire HER does not seem to show any specific zones for which there is an archaeological alert.

The request was initially to confirm that Rushcliffe as a geographic area does not have any AAZs. The areas of specific interest were the centre of Bradmore and Normanton on the Wolds. I am aware that Normanton on the Wolds has areas of archaeological interest around the village, but my area of concern is the centre of the village adjacent to Old Melton Road
