



4g Wireless Router

Setup and Guidance

This guide shows the simple process required to initially set up your new device. Please follow the steps in sequence.

Additionally, there is some useful information with regard to staying safe whilst online.

In the box, you'll find a:

- Multilingual quick start guide
- 4G wireless router
- Battery
- Micro-USB charging cable





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Gently remove the back cover

<u>Take a note of</u> the SSID and the Wi-Fi key on the label, you'll need this to get online





Insert the battery and replace the back cover







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Press the side button to power up the device


The lights will change colour while

it is getting ready, they'll go from green to red and back to green, then the router is ready to use





On your laptop or tablet, click the Network icon on the taskbar. If you don't see one of these network icons, click the **^** symbol on the taskbar and you should see it there.



Tick the box that says "**Connect automatically**" so that your device will always connect to the router when it is turned on

Then click Connect







Enter the **Wifi Key** that you noted down earlier, and click **next**



Things to Remember...

Do not remove the SIM, the router will stop working

The router will only operate with the SIM card that is already installed. Attempting to use the SIM card with any other device will either not give a data connection or will cause the SIM card to become barred.

Charging your router

Connect the micro-USB charging cable included into the micro-USB port on the bottom of the device and connect the other end to any USB charger.
