The County Council has an approved list of transport projects that it has an aspiration for some level of improvement. These are not fully worked up schemes and it does not mean that these schemes are in any programme for future delivery but just that it recognises an issue in these locations and will look to see if there are future opportunities for localised improvements. The list was last updated and approved at Committee in March 2018 - Report attached.

The only scheme which is more advanced, where an Outline Business Case has been prepared, and with a proposed programme for delivery is the A614/A6097 corridor improvement. The Committee report relevant to this scheme is attached, and the OBC is still with the Department for Transport awaiting approval for programme entry as part of the Department's Major Route Network proposals. Report attached from May 2019 gives an overview of this project.
