The figures are taken from the last Government return. It will include both additional costs from responding to Covid-19 pandemic and additional costs that are funded from Government to support the most vulnerable in our community such as Infection Control.

- 1. What is your current predicted in-year expenditure increase due to Covid-19 by the end of the financial year 2020/21? £64.2m
- 2. What is your current predicted in-year decrease in income due to Covid-19 by the end of the financial year 2020/21? £7.7m
- 3. What is your current predicted in-year expenditure reduction made on budgeted services by the end of the financial year 2020/21? Forecast position at Pd 6 is £2.5m underspend. This is not cuts to services
- 4. How much extra money do you predict to take from reserves over the amount that was included in the pre-year budget by the end of the financial year 2020/21? £0m

- a. How much extra money have you received from central government in Covid-specific grants since the start of the financial year? – £79.4m
 General and specific COVID 19 grants e.g. Infection Control, Test & Trace, Emergency Assistance Fund, Winter Support Grant etc. Further grants have been announced but £ amounts have not yet been notified.
- b. How much extra money do you believe the government's commitment to covering 75p on the £1 of lost income (excluding the first 5% of lost income) will be worth to your council by the end of the financial year? £1.2m to the end of July 2020 and further work is required to identify what is claimable for the full year.
- c. How much do you believe the phased repayments of council tax and business rates deficits over the next 3 years will be worth to your council by the end of the financial year? Our district and borough councils have indicated the estimated shortfall on CT/BR is £10m. This can be spread over 3 years rather than funded wholly in 2021/22. Recent Government announcement that 75% of this will be funded will reduce this figure.
- 6. What is your current predicted funding gap by the end of the financial year 2020/21? Prior to any savings decisions, and before any decision has been made on possible Social Care levy, the 3 year funding gap in the MTFS to 2023/24 is f50.8m
