


ACTIVE TRAVEL FUND - DOVECOTE LANE, BEESTON

A scheme is proposed on Dovecote Lane, Beeston, as part of Nottinghamshire County Council's Active Travel Fund Programme. The scheme proposes motor vehicles are prohibited from accessing Dovecote Lane from Middle Street and vice versa as a trial. This will involve the introduction of an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order. The experimental prohibition is to be enforced by three planters which will be installed in the carriageway at the northern end of Dovecote Lane between West End and Middle Street, near to numbers 2 and 4 Highfield Court, these will physically prevent the route being used as a through-route for motor vehicles while maintaining access for pedestrians and cyclists. The closure will provide a quiet route for cyclists and link the National Cycle Network route 6 to the town centre and wider cycle network.

Before proceeding further, a consultation is being undertaken on the proposal. The consultation will commence on Thursday 17 March 2022 and will run for four weeks.
