

**THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (A614/A6097 JUNCTIONS  
IMPROVEMENT SCHEME) (SIDE ROADS) ORDER 2022**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980**

The Nottinghamshire County Council (“the Council”) makes this Order in exercise of its powers under Sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and all other powers enabling it in that behalf: -

1. (1) The Council is authorised in relation to the classified and unclassified roads within the District of Newark and Sherwood and the Borough of Rushcliffe in the County of Nottinghamshire to: -
  - i. improve the lengths of highway named in the Schedules to this Order and shown on the corresponding Site Plans by cross hatching;
  - ii. stop up each length of highway described in the Schedules and shown on the corresponding Site Plan by zebra hatching;
  - iii. construct a new highway along each route whose centre line is shown on a Site Plan by an unbroken black line surrounded by stipple;
  - iv. stop up each private means of access to premises described in the Schedules and shown on the corresponding Site Plan by a solid black band;
  - v. provide new private means of access to premises at each location shown on a Site Plan by thin diagonal hatching.

(2) Where a new highway is to be constructed wholly or partly along the same route as a new access or part of one, that new highway shall be created subject to the private rights over that new access.

(3) Each new highway is given a reference letter on a Site Plan, which is also placed in the respective Schedule and will be a road unless the word “footpath” appears beneath its reference letter in that Schedule, in which case it will be a footpath. Each new access is given a number on a Site Plan, which is also placed in the respective Schedule.

(4) Where a new highway is to be constructed or a new access is to be provided in connection with the stopping up of a length of highway or private means of access described in a Schedule, its reference letter or number (as the case may be) is placed in that Schedule opposite the description of that length.

(5) Each Site Plan shows the works indicated in the respective Schedule, has the same number as that Schedule, and shows the route of the classified road in relation to those works.

2. Where immediately before a length of highway is stopped up in pursuance of this Order there is under, in, on, over, along or across that highway any apparatus of statutory undertakers or any telecommunications code system operator then, subject to section 21 of the Highways Act 1980, those undertakers, or that operator, as the case may be, shall continue to have the same rights as respects that apparatus as they had immediately before the stopping up took place.
3. In this Order: -
  - 1) distances are measured along the route of the relevant highway or private means of access to premises, as the case may be;
  - 2) a reference to a Schedule or Site Plan number is a reference to the Schedule or Site Plan so numbered;

3) “classified road” - means the classified highway along the A614 / A6097 corridor which extends from the A614/A616/A6075 Ollerton Roundabout to A6097 / East Bridgford Road / Kirk Hill Junction which the Council proposes to construct and improve at the following sixfive existing junctions within the Newark and Sherwood District and Borough of Rushcliffe in the County of Nottinghamshire:-

- a. A614 / A616 / A6075 roundabout – referred to as Ollerton Roundabout
- ~~b. A614 / Mickledale Lane crossroads – referred to as Mickledale Lane Junction;~~
- ~~e.b.~~ A614 / Mansfield Road roundabout – referred to as White Post Roundabout;
- ~~d.c.~~ A614 / A6097 priority junction – referred to as Warren Hill Junction;
- ~~e.d.~~ A6097 / A612 Nottingham Road / Southwell Road roundabout – referred to as Lowdham Roundabout;
- ~~f.e.~~ A6097 / Kirk Hill signalised crossroads – referred to as Kirk Hill Junction

and which is a highway which is a classified road in accordance with section 12 of the Highways Act 1980.

“the Council” - means the Nottinghamshire County Council;

“improvement” - in relation to a highway includes diverting, raising, lowering or otherwise altering that highway, and “improved” shall be construed accordingly;

“new access” - means a means of access to premises authorised by this Order to be provided;

“new highway” - means a new highway authorised by this Order to be constructed and “new highways” shall be construed accordingly;

“Schedule” - means a Schedule to this Order, and “Schedules” shall be construed accordingly;

“Site Plan” - means one of the sixfive plans numbered 1 of 6, ~~2 of 6~~, 3 of 6, 4 of 6, 5 of 6 and 6 of 6 respectively, contained in the plan folio marked “The Nottinghamshire County Council (A614/A6097 Junctions Improvement Scheme) (Side Roads) Order 2022” sealed with the Common Seal of the Council and deposited at the offices of Nottinghamshire County Council at County Hall, Loughborough Road, West Bridgford, Nottingham, NG2 7QP and a duplicate has been deposited in the offices of the Secretary of State for Transport. Duplicates have also been deposited at Ollerton and Boughton Town Hall, Sherwood Drive, Ollerton, Newark, NG22 9PP.

“unclassified road” – means the highway along the A614 / A6097 corridor which extends from the A614/A616/A6075 Ollerton Roundabout to A6097 / East Bridgford Road / Kirk Junction which the Council proposes to construct and improve at the following sixfive existing junctions within the Newark and Sherwood District and Borough of Rushcliffe in the County of Nottinghamshire:-

- ~~g.f.~~ A614 / A616 / A6075 roundabout – referred to as Ollerton Roundabout
- ~~h. A614 / Mickledale Lane crossroads – referred to as Mickledale Lane Junction;~~
- ~~i.g.~~ A614 / Mansfield Road roundabout – referred to as White Post Roundabout;
- ~~j.h.~~ A614 / A6097 priority junction – referred to as Warren Hill Junction;
- ~~k.i.~~ A6097 / A612 Nottingham Road / Southwell Road roundabout – referred to as Lowdham Roundabout;
- ~~l.j.~~ A6097 / Kirk Hill signalised crossroads – referred to as Kirk Hill Junction

and which does not fall within the meaning of a classified road pursuant to section 12 of the Highways Act 1980.

<p>Improvements are required along the existing A614 Old Rufford Road south of its junction with Mickledale Lane. Works to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Construction of a new three-arm roundabout to interface with the new unnumbered classified highway that links the A614 to Mickledale Lane, with two circulatory lanes provided around the roundabout;</li> <li>• Carriageway widened on each arm of the new roundabout to maximise capacity;</li> <li>• Improved footway link on the eastern side of A614 Old Rufford Road between the new roundabout and existing Mickledale Lane junction.</li> </ul> <p>Improvements are required along the existing Mickledale Lane, works to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Construction of a new mini-roundabout on Mickledale Lane to interface with the new classified unnumbered highway;</li> <li>• The westernmost part of Mickledale Lane will be subject to a prohibition of motor vehicles between the new mini-roundabout and the A614. This restriction will require a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO), that will be processed separately.</li> </ul>

Works to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A merge will be provided on the A614, to segregate vehicles travelling north on the A614 and those joining from the A6097. The entire extent will be subject to carriageway resurfacing.</li> <li>• A prohibition of U-turn is required to prevent vehicles travelling from the south on the A614 from performing a U-turn to access the southbound carriageway of the A6097. This restriction will require a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO), that will be processed separately.</li> </ul>

Works to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Increasing the size of the roundabout, creating an elliptical shape, with two circulatory lanes provided around the roundabout;</li> <li>• Speed limit reduced to 30mph on all approaches to the roundabout, with the exception of Southwell Road which has an existing 30mph speed limit;</li> <li>• Carriageway widening on A612 Nottingham Road and A6097 Epperstone By-pass, to increase capacity;</li> <li>• Toucan crossing provided on A6097 Epperstone By-pass.</li> </ul>

<p>Improvements are required along the existing A6097, East Bridgford Road and Kirk Hill. Works to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A6097 – Strip widening on both sides to incorporate dedicated right turn facilities for vehicles turning into East Bridgford Road and Kirk Hill junctions and amended junction layout. At a point 252 metres south east of Kirk Hill, a new Pegasus crossing will be provided, linking the existing Bridleway No. 28 and East Bridgford Road, with the provision of a new bridleway on the southern side of the A6097.</li> <li>• East Bridgford Road – Tie-in works on the approach to its junction with the A6097 to incorporate the junction improvements.</li> <li>• Kirk Hill – Strip widening predominantly on the eastern side to incorporate the junction improvements. A new bridleway is to be constructed on the northern side of Kirk Hill to tie-in to the existing East Bridgford Bridleway No. 28.</li> </ul>
