
4 points: Children of parents or carers' who demonstrate regular worship at least on a monthly basis to St Michael and All Angels Church, Bramcote either at Sunday Worship or at midweek groups where worship is the primary focus, over the past year, in order to be considered for a foundation place. A reference will be sought from the church minister to confirm their frequency of attendance.

3 Points: Children of parents or carers' who demonstrate regular worship at another Christian Church at least on a monthly basis; that is a member of Churches together in England, Evangelical Alliance or other Christian churches of a Trinitarian faith, either at Sunday Worship or at midweek groups where worship is the primary focus, over the past year.
