## **Report of the Chair of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Adults Select Committee**

### **Work Programme**

#### **Purpose of the report**

1. To consider and agree the future work programme.

#### **Background**

2. The Overview and Scrutiny Committee at its meeting on February 18 2008 commissioned a Select Committee to contribute to policy development within the safeguarding vulnerable adults' agenda. It would consider the impact of the wider safeguarding remit and if policies and procedures/services reflect the requirements of forthcoming legislation.
3. At its first meeting the Select Committee received an initial presentation by departmental officers which provided information concerning the arrangements in Nottinghamshire for safeguarding vulnerable adults. This included details about the move from Adult Protection to Safeguarding Adults and the establishment of separate safeguarding arrangements for the City and the County. The implications of the Mental Capacity Act (MCA) 2005 and the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006 were also discussed.
4. The Select Committee focused on the role of partners at the meeting on the 2 June. Representatives from Nottinghamshire tPCT and Nottinghamshire Police attended and informed Members about their responsibilities and procedures for the safeguarding of vulnerable adults; they also discussed what they considered to be the key issues. Members also learnt about the Mental Capacity Act, the plans in place for its implementation in Nottinghamshire and a brief overview of the Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards.
5. At the third meeting on the 7 July the Select Committee received information from a representative of the Nottingham City Council about the development of the separate safeguarding board in the City. A Service user also attended to discuss issues relating to what makes

people feel safe and what is expected to be provided by services that offer support within the community.

### **Issues**

6. It is anticipated that the last meeting of the Select Committee will be in September – date to be confirmed at which Members will be presented with a draft summary of the evidence gathered during the course of the review and its associated recommendations.

### **Recommendations**

1. It is recommended that the Safeguarding Vulnerable Adults Select Committee –
  - Agrees any issues around the future work programme.
