REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL SERVICES

NATIONAL SOCIAL SERVICES CONFERENCE 2004

1. Purpose of the Report

1.1 To outline the arrangements for this year's Annual Social Services Conference being held at the Civic Centre, Newcastle upon Tyne from 20th to 22nd October 2004.

2. Information and Advice

- 2.1 The Conference is run jointly by the Association of Directors of Social Services and the Local Government Association and is of value to councillors, senior officers, policy makers and service managers in the statutory, voluntary and private sector involved in social care, children's and health services.
- 2.2 The theme of this year's Conference is 'Communities that Care, Services that Deliver'. Its aim is to explore how we can build sustainable communities that promote well-being and are safe, caring and supportive.
- 2.3 The programme will consist of a mix of keynote and ministerial addresses with a wide variety of participatory workshops and networking sessions.
- 2.4 Policy sessions of particular interest to the County Council include:

- Safeguarding Children and Supporting Families
- Making Extra Care Work
- Healthier Communities
- Children's Inter-Agency Group
- Implementing the National Service Framework for Older People
- Valuing People
- Finding Creative Ways to improve education, training and employment for care leavers
- New Mental Health Act What does it mean for Social Services?
- 2.5 The Director of Social Services recommends that the County Council is represented at this Conference which gives delegates an opportunity to consider how changes and work in social care, health and other policy areas can make a real difference to people's lives.

3. Statutory and Policy Implications

3.1 This report has been compiled after consideration of implications in respect of finance, equal opportunities, personnel, crime and disorder and users.
