Background

- **Multi agency review group (November 2007)**
 - to review the function of Day Hospital Services provided by Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust to ensure that it meets both local and national expectations and meets accepted models of good practice and guidance in relation to assessment and treatment.

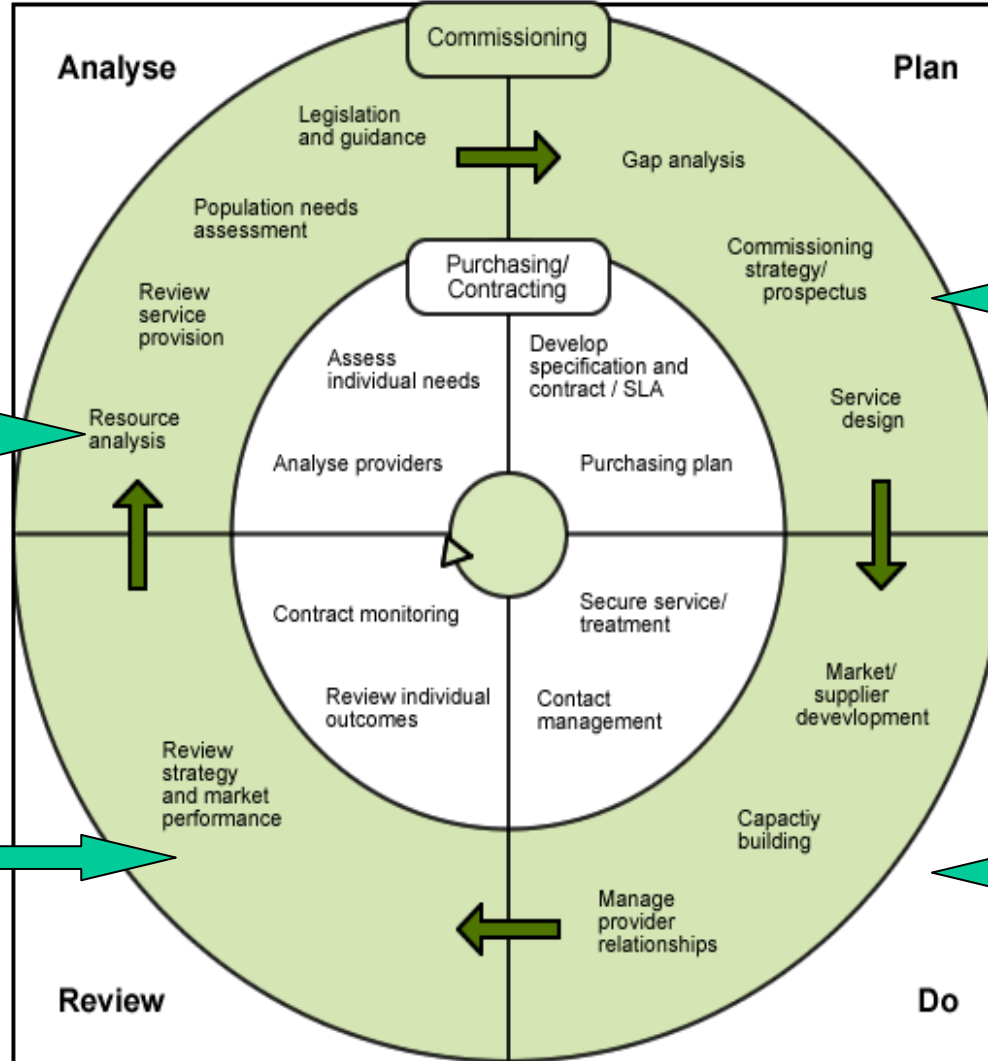
