COUNTRYSIDE ACCESS (DEFINITIVE MAP) SCHEDULE OF CASE FILES

Purpose of the Report

1. To provide an update to Planning and Licencing Committee members on the progress of Definitive Map case files.

Information and Advice

- 2. This report provides members with an update on the range of public right of way applications which are presently being processed, and identifies any developments which have taken place in connection with the cases.
- 3. Appendix 1 sets out the existing caseload in tabular form, and indicates the stage which has been reached for each individual case.
- 4. The current backlog of claims for public rights of way is 260 paths. However, path claims are usually grouped into one legal order or case therefore the backlog of 260 paths equates to 93 individual outstanding cases.
- 5. Members of the Committee may also wish to view the recently revised statutory Rights of Way Modification Order Application Register (an example is shown in Appendix 2 and 3). The register is a list of all outstanding claims made by members of the public for changes to the County's legal record of public rights of way the Definitive Map and Statement. This is available to view on the County Council's internet site on the countryside access and rights of way pages.
