REPORT OF THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR, REGENERATION

HOSPITALITY FOR DRUG SCRUTINY SEMINARS

Purpose of Report

1. To approve the expenditure on a buffet lunch at a series of 4 scrutiny seminars on drugs being organised by the County Council

Information and Advice

- 2. Approval is sought within the terms of the Council's Conference and Travel Policy for expenditure on buffet lunches to be provided at four seminars due to happen between now and the end of March 2005.
- 3. The seminars, to be chaired by Cllr Bosnjak, will offer an opportunity to see how the County Council and its partners within the County are impacting on the use of drugs, drug related crime and improving access to treatment.
- 4. Invitations to these 4 seminars have been extended to County Council Members, district and borough councils, PCT, Probation, Police and other key agencies and authorities involved in the fight against drugs and their impact on Nottinghamshire people and communities.
- 5. Addressing drug issues within the County is a clear objective within the County Council's strategic plan. Scrutinising the work done within this area of activity will identify opportunities for more effective joint working and areas for improvement or development.
- 6. Invitations have been extended to upwards of 100 people but at this stage exact numbers of attendees are not known.
