Guidance Sheet

Licensing Act Provisions/Offences

There are various requirements under the Licensing Act which you must comply with in order to sell alcohol. Below is a brief summary of **some** of the requirements which we will investigate and could take formal action upon, including prosecution or a Review of the licence in front of the Licensing Board.

- 1. You must have a licence in order to sell or supply alcohol
- 2. You must comply with all the conditions on your licence. These will include things like:
 - The times when alcohol can be sold
 - Correct details for the Premises Licence Holder
 - Correct details for the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS)
 - Annex 1 Mandatory conditions (see below)
 - Annex 2 Operating Schedule conditions. These are the conditions you submitted when you applied for the Licence and could include things such as having a fully functioning CCTV or Challenge 25 policy, etc. You may not have included any conditions under this section.
 - Annex 3 Licensing Authority imposed conditions. These are
 where the Licensing Board have seen fit to impose conditions on
 your premises and usually follow a Review of the Licence.
 - Annex 4 Plan. When you submitted your application, you will have submitted a plan of the premises indicating the area(s) in the shop where alcohol may be sold. A copy of this should have been returned to you when you received the Licence and must be kept with the Licence and made available for inspection on request.
- 3. Mandatory Conditions on the Licence include:
 - There must always be a DPS and a Premises Licence Holder for alcohol to be sold.
 - You must have a policy in order to avoid the sale of alcohol to children under the age of 18 (coming in October 2010)
- 4. You must display an up to date Licence Summary or a certified copy in a prominent position within the premises.
- 5. You must keep the Premises Licence or a certified copy in a safe place on the premises and available for inspection on request. This must include a copy of the plan of the premises detailing where alcohol may be displayed for sale.
- 6. The DPS must also be a personal licence holder

- 7. All staff who sell/supply alcohol must be authorised by the DPS or a personal licence holder. Best practice is to have this authorisation in writing.
- 8. No person under the age of 18 can sell/supply alcohol. This means that if you have someone under the age of 18 on the till, an adult must authorise **each individual sale** of alcohol. Best practice is to avoid having children under the age of 18 on the till.
- 9. It is an offence to sell alcohol to someone who is drunk
